Dear Ms. Hickey,

On October 19, 2021, Interwest Energy Alliance filed a motion for permission to be represented by an out-of-state attorney. Utah Admin. Code R746-1-107 states as follows:

- (1) A party may:
  - (a) be represented by:
    - (i) an attorney licensed to practice in Utah; or
    - (ii) an attorney licensed in a foreign state, if the attorney provides the Commission with a certificate of good standing from the state where licensed;
  - (b) represent oneself individually; or
  - (c) if not an individual, represent itself through an officer or employee.
- (2) An attorney who appears pursuant to Subsection R746-1-107(1)(a)(ii) is not required to:
  - (a) apply for pro hac vice admission to the Utah State Bar; or
  - (b) partner with counsel licensed in Utah.

Under Utah Admin. Code R746-1-107, a motion is not necessary; however, the filing appears to meet the requirements of Utah Admin. Code R746-1-107.
