Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Rocky Mountain Power's (RMP) Notice of Intent to Use Export Credit Rate (ECR) Input filed on December 1, 2021 and its corrected public workpaper filed on December 21, 2021 ("Notice"). The Notice was filed pursuant to the PSC's August 11, 2021 Order approving a method to update inputs associated with the ECR in Docket No. 17-035-61 ("Order").¹ The PSC also reviewed the December 30, 2021 comments provided by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU).

DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge the Notice, and comments that RMP's Notice in this docket generally appears to follow the requirements of the Order, stating RMP provides the various input data, information, and applicable references either in workpapers, or reference to other public, state, or federal sources for the inputs it proposes to update. DPU further comments the information from the line loss study used in the most recent general rate case (GRC) may be dated, and that it will continue to monitor the information until the next GRC.

Based on the PSC's review of the Notice and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges the Notice as complying with the requirements of the Order.
