The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the August 27, 2021 Tariff Compliance Filing (“Filing”) submitted by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) in accordance with the PSC’s August 26, 2021 Order (“Order”) in Docket No. 20-035-20. The Filing revises RMP’s Electric Service Schedule No. 3, Low Income Lifeline Program – Residential Service Option for Qualifying Customers (“Schedule 3”) to reflect a maximum monthly low income lifeline credit of \$13.95, and Electric Service Schedule No. 91, Surcharge to Fund Low Income Residential Lifeline Program (“Schedule 91”) to reflect a monthly lifeline surcharge of \$0.00.

The PSC also reviewed the September 10, 2021 comments submitted by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) recommending the PSC approve RMP’s Filing. DPU states the Filing complies with the PSC’s Order and Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D), and recommends an effective date of October 1, 2021 for the revisions to Schedule 3 and Schedule 91.

Based on the PSC’s review of RMP’s Filing and DPU’s comments and recommendation, the PSC approves RMP’s Filing, effective October 1, 2021.
