Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Rocky Mountain Power's (RMP) Utah Wildland Fire Protection Plan Cost and Compliance Report ("Report") filed on June 1, 2022 pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §§ 54-24-201(4) and 54-24-202(2) and Utah Admin. Code R746-315-3. The Report provides an update on RMP's progress in implementing its Wildland Fire Protection Plan approved in Docket No. 20-035-28 ("Plan"). The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed comments on June 28, 2022.

DPU recommends that the PSC acknowledge the Report as complying with the relevant statutory requirements. In making its recommendation, DPU identified two updates to RMP's Plan, specifically updates to the Line Rebuild Program and the implementation of Advanced Weather Forecasting. Additionally, DPU summarizes RMP's assertion regarding the variation in actual to planned expenditures due to the ongoing impacts of Covid-19 and RMP's proposed actions to make up for project delays.

Based on the PSC's review of the Report and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges that RMP's filing of the Report satisfies the relevant reporting requirements of Utah Code Ann. § 54-24-201(4) and § 54-24-202(2), and Utah Admin. Code R746-315-3.
