Dear Ms. Saba,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Rocky Mountain Power's (RMP) 2021 Annual Cost of Service Study (COSS) model and supporting exhibits, filed on June 13, 2022 in accordance with the PSC's May 29, 2014 correspondence in Docket No. 14-999-01. The PSC also reviewed the July 12, 2022 Corrected Comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU).

DPU states its review consisted of comparing the 2021 COSS model with RMP's 2020 COSS model. DPU explains that the 2021 COSS model is materially the same in form as the 2020 COSS model, but it is updated for RMP's end-of-year 2021 results of operations. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge the 2021 COSS. Additionally, DPU comments that RMP omitted the class summary, production summary, transmission summary, distribution summary, retail summary, and miscellaneous summary tabs ("Omitted Summary Tabs") from the 2021 COSS and requests that all future filings include the Omitted Summary Tabs for greater ease in examining RMP's COSS model.

Based on the PSC's review of RMP's 2021 COSS filing and DPU's recommendations, the PSC acknowledges that the filing complies with the PSC's reporting requirement. In light of DPU's request for future filings to include the Omitted Summary Tabs, the PSC requests that RMP include the referenced summaries in all future cost of service studies.
