The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the January 27, 2022 Tariff Filing ("Filing") submitted by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) in accordance with the PSC's August 26, 2021 Order ("Order") in Docket No. 20-035-20. The Filing revises RMP's Electric Service Schedule No. 91, Surcharge to Fund Low Income Residential Lifeline Program ("Schedule 91") to reinstate the lifeline surcharge after a five month moratorium. RMP states it has monitored the Lifeline Account balance and believes the surplus is sufficiently reduced to justify reinstating the lifeline surcharge.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on February 3, 2022 recommending the PSC approve RMP's revisions to Schedule 91 with an effective date of March 1, 2022. DPU comments that it agrees with RMP's assessment of the surplus balance and states that the Filing complies with the PSC's Order and Utah Admin. Code R746-405-2(D). No other comments were received prior to the end of the comment period for tariff filings, February 18, 2022.

Based on the PSC's review of the RMP's Filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves RMP's Filing, effective March 1, 2022.
