Re: Advice Letter No. 22-03, Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service; Docket No. 22-035-T08

Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the June 3, 2022 filing by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service, Sheet No. 135.4 ("Tariff Revisions"). The Tariff Revisions update the rates applicable to large non-residential customers who select the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Form No. 1 compensation method to receive credit for net excess generation. RMP states the Tariff Revisions are being made pursuant to the PSC's February 12, 2009 Report and Order Directing Tariff Modifications in Docket No. 08-035-78 ("2009 Order").

The PSC also reviewed the June 21, 2022 comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). DPU states that there is negligible difference between the information in RMP's filing and its FERC Form No. 1, and that the Tariff Revisions comply with the 2009 Order. Based on those observations, DPU recommends the PSC approve the Tariff Revisions with an effective date of July 1, 2022.

RMP did not file its proposed Tariff revisions 30 or more calendar days before the requested effective date as required under Utah Admin. Code R746-405-1(C)(2). Nevertheless, the PSC approves the proposed revisions, but reminds RMP that its failure to comply with the requirements set forth in Utah Admin. Code R746-405-1(C)(2) in future filings might delay or prevent approval. Based on the PSC's review of the filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, RMP's Second Revision of Sheet No. 135.4 is approved as filed, effective July 1, 2022.
