Re: *Rocky Mountain Power's Filing in Compliance with the PSC's Order Issued on June 13, 2022 in Docket No. 21-035-70, Rocky Mountain Power's Evaluation of Electric Vehicle Time of Use Pilot Program, Docket No. 22-035-T10*

Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the June 24, 2022 Tariff Compliance Filing (the "Filing") by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 2E – Residential Service – Electric Vehicle Time-of-Use Pilot, sheets 2E.1, 2E.2, and 2E.3; and Electric Service Schedule No. 120 – Plug-in Electric Vehicle Incentive Pilot Program, sheets 120.1 and 120.2 ("Tariff Revisions"). The Tariff Revisions reflect the agreed upon changes included in the Settlement Stipulation ("Stipulation"), approved by the PSC's, June 13, 2022 order ("Order") in Docket No. 21-035-70.

The PSC also reviewed the June 30, 2022 comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). DPU states that RMP filed its Second Revision of Sheet No. 2E.1, Third Revision of Sheet No. 2E.2, Second Revision of Sheet No. 2E.3, First Revision of Sheet 120.1, and Second Revision of Sheet No. 120.2, in compliance with the Order, and that they comply with the Stipulation. DPU concludes therefore that the Filing is just and reasonable and in the public interest, and recommends the PSC approve them, effective July 1, 2022.

Based on the PSC's review of the Filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, RMP's proposed Tariff revisions are approved as filed, effective July 1, 2022.
