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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 -000-PRESIDING OFFICER: Well, we should all be 3 4 here for the -- pardon me -- hearing -- virtual hearing 5 noticed on interim rates in the Docket Number 6 23-035-15. That's Rocky Mountain Power's Application 7 for Authority to Revise Tariff Schedule 98, Renewable 8 Energy Credits Balancing Account. 9 My name is Mike Hammer. I'm the Commission's designated presiding officer. Let's go ahead and take 10 11 appearances, beginning with Rocky Mountain Power, 12 please. 13 MR. ROGALA: Thank you, Your Honor. Good 14 morning, everyone. Zachary Rogala for the Company. 15 Happy to be here. PRESIDING OFFICER: Welcome. Ms. Schmid? 16 17 MS. SCHMID: Thank you. Patricia E. Schmid 18 and Patrick Grecu of the Utah Attorney General's 19 Office. We are assistant attorney generals for the 20 Division. Thank you. 21 PRESIDING OFFICER: Welcome. And are there 22 any other parties that would like to enter an 23 appearance? MS. SCHMID: I have communicated with the 24 25 Office and with UAE, and neither is planning on

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1 participating today. 2 PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you, Ms. Schmid. Okay. Is there anything before we ask 3 Mr. Rogala to call his first witness? 4 All right. Mr. Rogala, I'll ask you to do so. 5 6 Thanks. 7 MR. ROGALA: Yeah. Thank -- thank you, Your Honor. We're here today requesting interim approval of 8 9 the Company's annual Schedule 98 REC balancing account adjustment. This year's adjustment results in a 10 11 pass-through of an overall \$1.1 million refund to Utah 12 customers. 13 But before I call our chief witness, with the 14 Commission's permission, I would like to move for admission of our application and accompanying exhibits. 15 16 PRESIDING OFFICER: They're admitted. 17 MR. ROGALA: All right. Thank you. 18 Your Honor, I'd like to call our witness Shelley McCoy today. Also on the call are Company 19 20 witnesses Robert Meredith and Marcelina Hundis, but 21 Shelley McCoy will be our principal witness. So --22 PRESIDING OFFICER: I'll go ahead and swear 23 her then. 2.4 MR. ROGALA: Yep. Thank you. 25 PRESIDING OFFICER: Ms. McCoy, do you swear to Page 5

1 Α. So I have a bachelor's of science degree in 2 I've taken numerous regulatory leadership accounting. 3 conferences -- trainings and conferences, and my responsibilities are overseeing the calculation of the 4 5 revenue requirement, reporting regulatory earnings, and 6 overseeing the jurisdictional allocation for reporting in the six states in which we serve. 7 Thank you. And in this position, have you had Ο. 8 9 the opportunity to review the Company's application and 10 relevant exhibits in this proceeding? 11 Yes, I have. Α. 12 And have you prepared a statement regarding 0. your review of those materials? 13 14 Α. Yes. 15 Can you please provide that for the Ο. 16 Commission? 17 Α. Definitely. Good morning. On March 15th, 18 2023, Rocky Mountain Power filed its annual renewable energy credit balancing account, or RBA, seeking to 19 20 refund a deferral balance to Utah customers through 21 Schedule 98 of approximately \$1.1 million over a 22 one-year period beginning June 1st, 2023. The RBA deferral is calculated as the 23 difference between actual REC revenue realized by the 2.4 25 Company and the amount in rates during the deferral Page 7

period or calendar year 2022. The refund amount also includes a net carrying charge during the 2022 deferral period and the interim period of January 1st, 2023, through May 31st, 2023, of approximately \$92,000. The deferral balance was calculated in a manner consistent with previous RBA filings.

7 Ms. Hundis, Mr. Meredith, and myself filed testimony in support of the Company's application, 8 9 describing the calculations. My testimony describes the calculation of the deferral amounts and the amount 10 11 of REC revenue allocated to Utah rate payers. 12 Ms. Hundis's testimony presents detailed accounting of 13 total Company REC revenue for calendar year 2022, and Mr. Meredith's testimony addresses the allocation of 14 15 the RBA surcharge among the customer classes and the

16 resulting tariff Schedule 98 rates in this case.
17 On April 26th, 2023, the Division of Public
18 Utilities filed comments in support of the proposed
19 rate change becoming effective on an interim basis on
20 June 1st, 2023, to name their final audit of the REC

21 revenues contained in this filing. No other party22 filed comments in this phase of the proceeding.

The Company respectfully requests the Commission approve the Company's request to return to customers \$1.1 million associated with this RBA filing

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1 on an interim basis beginning June 1st, 2023. 2 Thank you. Thank you, Ms. McCoy. 3 Q. Great. MR. ROGALA: And, Your Honor, Rocky Mountain 4 5 Power tenders this witness for cross-examination and 6 questions from the hearing officer. 7 PRESIDING OFFICER: Just one. And I think this is trivial because you just stated the new 8 9 tariffs -- tariff Schedule 98 rates were proposed to be 10 effective June 1st, 2023, and it says so on page 6 of 11 the application. But we noticed on page 5 it proposes they become effective on June 1st, 2022. I think it's 12 13 obviously a typo, but I just wanted to confirm on the 14 record that I'm not missing something. 15 THE WITNESS: That is correct, yes. We are 16 requesting they become effective June 1st, 2023. 17 PRESIDING OFFICER: Okay. Ms. Schmid any 18 questions? 19 MS. SCHMID: No questions. Okay. Good morning, everybody. As the 3 Α. Company has stated, Schedule 98 tracks the difference 4 5 between renewable energy credits, or REC revenues, 6 included in rates and actual REC revenues collected 7 from the sale of RECs by the Company. The variances between REC revenues included in rates and actual REC 8 9 revenues collected are identified and deferred each 10 month for one calendar year.

Annually, on March 15th, a renewable energy credits balancing account, or RBA, application is filed to present the variances, including applicable carrying charges with a hundred percentage true-up for the difference between the amounts in rates and actual sales occurring through Schedule 98, if prudent.

The collection or credit, under Schedule 98, will be made annually effective June 1st. The application under this docket is the 11th deferred RBA rate adjustment.

The Company proposes to refund 1.1 million over one year from June 1st, 2023, through May 31st, 2024. This is a net increase of 369,000 or .02 percent. The Company also proposes to allocate the 2023 RBA deferral revenue across customer classes based

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on the cost of service factor ten.

1

This docket marks the fourth year of the inclusion of Kennecott contract revenue, which represents the revenue the Company received from the non-generation and REC supply agreement between Kennecott Utah Copper LLC and PacifiCorp dated April 8th, 2019.

The Commission's standard for evaluating 8 9 whether to approve an interim rate -- an interim rate 10 request in an energy balancing account application is 11 found in Utah Code Section 54-7-13.5, which states that the Company must make an accessible first look showing 12 13 that the proposed interim rate appears consistent with 14 prior years' filings and the interim rate requested is 15 more likely to reflect actual costs than the current 16 rates. The Division adopts this standard to evaluate 17 Rocky Mountain Power's interim rate request in this 18 docket.

In summary, the Division has performed a preliminary review of the filing and corresponding Commission orders and found that, in general, the Company has complied with the Commission's orders and meets statutory standards for such applications. The proposed interim rate is more likely to reflect actual costs than the current rates.

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1 The Division recommends the Commission to 2 approve the chart -- the change to Schedule 98 as filed 3 and approve the rate increase on an interim basis until the Division can complete a final audit by July 17th, 4 5 2023, of the REC revenues contained in this filing. 6 MS. SCHMID: Mr. Christensen is now available 7 for cross-examination questions and questions from the presiding officer. 8 9 PRESIDING OFFICER: Mr. Rogala? 10 MR. ROGALA: No questions from me, Your Honor. 11 Great summary. Thank you. 12 PRESIDING OFFICER: And I have none. Thank 13 you, Mr. Christensen. 14 THE WITNESS: Thank you. 15 PRESIDING OFFICER: No other witnesses, 16 Ms. Schmid? 17 MS. SCHMID: No other witnesses. 18 PRESIDING OFFICER: All right. Is there 19 anything else before we adjourn? 20 MS. SCHMID: Nothing further from the 21 Division. 22 PRESIDING OFFICER: Thank you everyone for 23 your participation. Have a wonderful afternoon.
