Since 2019 Rocky Mountain Power has not delivered on our request to replace outdated above ground power infrastructure to below ground power lines, to our homes that are located at the Wildland Urban Interface, and have prioritized profits over safety.

4. Why do you (the Complainant) think these activities are illegal, unjust or improper?

Our outdated power lines have a high rate of weather impacted downed lines, and given the lines are over Utah Department of Natural Resources Rated extreme wildfire risk zone, our neighborhood is at a high risk to wildfires associated with the Rocky Mountain Power above ground lines. Current events in CA, OR, CO, and HI show the real risk associated with wildfires from above ground electrical lines. RMP has not followed through with under grounding our lines over the past 4 years. 5. What relief does the Complainant request?

We request that Rocky Mountain Power upgrade our above ground lines to below ground lines along Northmont Way from E North Hills Way to Hilltop Road in Salt Lake City. As this is a replacement of outdated power lines in a extreme wildfire zone, we do not believe that ELECTRIC SERVICE REGULATION NO. 12 is applicable and that Rocky Mountain Power is responsible for the cost of moving the lines to below ground along Northmont Way.
