However, I do have two questions about the decision.

Why did the Commission grant Rocky Mountain Power's "Motion to Dismiss" when in fact the Commission goes on to state many parts of that Motion to Dismiss were misleading and inaccurate?

A more accurate Order from the Commission, I feel, should be categorized and called simply the "Findings of the Commission" are such and such or the "Orders of the Commission" are such and such.
