Re: Docket No. 23-035-T02, In the matter of Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed

Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 300, Regulation Charges.

Recommendation (Approve Tariff Sheets)

The Division of Public Utilities ("Division") recommends the Public Service Commission of Utah ("Commission") approve Rocky Mountain Power's ("RMP") proposed changes to tariff 300 revising the carrying charge from 3.05 percent to 4.57 percent, with an effective date of April 1, 2023.

Discussion

On January 26, 2023, RMP filed revised tariff sheets to implement the annual carrying charge. The Commission issued an action request to the Division with a due date of February 9, 2023. In response to the Commission's action request, the Division reviewed the filing and determined the proposed carrying charge of 4.57 percent was correctly calculated pursuant to the Commission's Order.¹

The carrying charge increase of 1.52 percent is a result of the Federal Reserve's interest rate increases over the past year with the intent to slow inflation in the economy generally. The Federal Reserve's current interest rate policies have resulted in an increase in Aaa and Baa published rates, albeit those increases have been smaller than interest rate increases

in the economy, generally. The increase in the published rates for Aaa and Baa rated bonds directly impacts the calculation of the RMP Tariff 300 carrying charge, resulting in a proposed carrying charge similar to the carrying charge in 2013.

Conclusion

Based on the Division's investigation, the Division finds the proposed carrying charge of 4.57 percent to be just, reasonable, and in the public interest, and recommends the Commission approve RMP's revised Schedule 300, increasing the carrying charge from 3.05 percent to 4.57 percent with an effective date of April 1, 2023.
