Re: *Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service; Docket No. 23-035-T07*

Dear Ms. Saba:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed the May 16, 2023 filing ("Filing") by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service, Sheet No. 135.4 ("Tariff Revisions"). The Tariff Revisions update the rates applicable to large non-residential customers that select the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Form No. 1 compensation method to receive credit for net excess generation. RMP states the Tariff Revisions are being made pursuant to the PSC's February 12, 2009 Report and Order Directing Tariff Modifications in Docket No. 08-035-78 ("2009 Order").

The PSC also reviewed the May 31, 2023 comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). According to DPU, compared to RMP's FERC Form 1 for Utah year ending December 31, 2022, the Filing is accurate and the derived rates are correct. DPU states there is a negligible difference between the information in RMP's Filing and its FERC Form No. 1, and the Tariff Revisions comply with the 2009 Order. On this basis, DPU states the proposed Tariff Revisions are just, reasonable, and in the public interest, and recommends the PSC approve them, effective July 1, 2023.

Based on the PSC's review of the filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, and there being no opposition, the Tariff Revisions are approved as filed, effective July 1, 2023.
