Dear Commissioners,

What is the current status of your investigation? We received another electric bill from Hurricane Power that was unfair and costly. We continue to beg the Commission to overturn the illegal transfer. Both parties conspired and knowingly did not follow proper procedures in the process. The City of Hurricane can now force annexation on us, something they couldn't have done prior to going forth with this fraudulent purchase of assets from RMP.

The bottom line is this:

Had Rocky Mountain Power followed the proper procedures as required by law and the PSC, we would have been notified and given a chance to provide feedback PRIOR to RMP getting approval. We were denied the right and because of that we are suffering tremendous harm. Provable real harm.

RMP knew the correct procedures and followed them every time in the past. But why not this time?

If RMP followed the rules and there was a public hearing, this transfer would not have gone through without our solar contracts being honored.

Hurricane City knew we were not part of the City and thus we had no voted representation or even prior knowledge of the sale until it was already signed by both conspiring parties. We acted immediately after getting notice that the sale had already been done and our meter was to be changed out. Against our protests, they continued forward. The City, nor RMP, did not give us any forum to discuss our concerns.

Your Commission was developed and funded by our great State to oversee non-municipal power companies to insure they follow State Laws and to provide a way for customers of these power companies to file complaints.

The Utah Department of Commerce's report clearly details the events that took place and points out that RMP didn't follow the proper procedures by failing to notify the PSC as they had on every prior occasion.

I suspect it was a conspiracy between the parties but even if it wasn't, the public was harmed. Especially the Solar customers. The Commission obligation should be to correct this harm.
