Dear Utah Public Service Commission Members,

My name is Katherine Johnson, I am a resident of Salt Lake County, an artist, a wife, and most importantly mother of a fantastic 3-year-old girl. I am writing to you to please **support Docket No: 25-035-06**. This will help Utah meet its goal of energy independence, clean the air in the valley, and hopefully lower our skyrocketing energy bills.

Those are the main reasons I care about Docket No: 25-035-06 - clean air, low energy costs and energy independence.

As a mother, I want to give my daughter the best environment possible for her to grow up. Utah, and especially the Salt Lake Valley, has a history of awful air pollution. Phasing out coal and natural gas from the electric grid would do wonders in improving air quality. I lived almost all my life in Utah, first in Provo, then in and around Ogen/Layton and for the past six years in Salt Lake. I now have exercise-induced asthma and my voice has suffered the air quality effects as well - I am part of the Utah Symphony choir, though singing feels harder every year. I want to keep my daughter from having the same fate, but still want to keep Utah our home.

Another reason is simply affordability. I have seen the rapid increase of energy costs in the last few years and I worry about how this trend could affect my family for years to come. Solar and wind energy have already proven much more economical alternatives to coal, and in recent years have shown to also be cheaper than natural gas. I believe adding them to the mix would stabilize - and in the long term, help reduce - energy costs.

Lastly, the monopoly that is Rocky Mountain Power has little incentive to move away from coal and gas. But the communities that form part of the Community Clean Energy Program have shown they want independence from fossil fuels. Approving Docket No: 25-035-06 would allow them the chance to diversify the electric energy mix.

To me, this is an obvious win-win-win situation. So I highly encourage you to support Docket No: 25-035-06. Thank you in advance for your consideration.
