As a resident and homeowner of Cottonwood Heights I am writing to ask that the PSC approve the proposed URC program. However, I'm very concerned that Rocky Mountain Power will try to undercut this program by undervaluing the new resources it brings online. Just look at how Rocky Mountain Power has proposed slashing the "avoided cost" price it is willing to pay for new energy by 40%. If Rocky Mountain Power won't build the new energy resources that Utah needs, then it must pay a fair price for the energy that programs like the community clean energy program want to deliver."

Rocky Mountain Power missed a huge opportunity to build low-cost, clean energy for Utah when the company cancelled its resource solicitation last year. I applaud the 19 communities that are proposing the community clean energy program for investing in their own resource solicitation, which this Commission approved. With clean energy tax credits set to end next year, the communities' resource solicitation may be the last good opportunity this decade to bring more low-cost clean energy online for Utah. I hope the PSC will approve this new program and be fair in its calculation of not only the costs but also the benefits that new program resources will bring.
