Dear Utah Public Service Commission,

I am writing to express my concerns about Rocky Mountain Power's 2025 Integrated Resource Plan. This plan prioritizes costly, harmful technologies while reversing plans to invest in clean, affordable energy, leaving Utah ratepayers to bear the financial and health burdens.

RMP's continued reliance on outdated coal plants and expensive carbon-capture technology is a risk-laden plan that threatens to drive up energy costs.

More than 80% of RMP's requested rate increases in the last two years were due to high coal and gas costs. Meanwhile, Utah stands to gain millions in tax revenue and thousands of jobs by expanding renewable energy, according to an analysis by Current Energy. Yet PacifiCorp's plan moves in the opposite direction.

I urge you to reject costly, high-risk continued reliance on fossil fuels and instead push Rocky Mountain Power and PacifiCorp to prioritize affordable, reliable clean energy that benefits Utah families and businesses. When RMP's pursuit of carbon capture and small-scale nuclear fail to materialize, it will be RMP's customers who pay the price. RMP should be investing in clean energy today, when it is cheapest, not waiting until the 2030s to commit. Utahns shouldn't have to pay more for decisions that benefit corporate shareholders and hurt our communities.

Please advocate for an energy plan that protects ratepayers, public health, and our economic future by rejecting PacifiCorp's current Integrated Resource Plan.

My husband and I purchased 28 solar panels and a battery over years. We believe in clean energy. We are helping the schools and other neighbors in our neighborhood to have cleaner air. Warren Buffet owns a coal mine in his other companies. RMP would ask that we support the profits of a failing industry with higher cost coal. It is predicted that there will be more robotic jobs for mining coal. This would decrease the health risks of mining coal, but it will decrease the already fewer jobs for coal than the jobs in solar. Solar combined with batteries make solar over a large area of the state highly reliable. We certainly shouldn't be paying the \$71/MWH for coal over the \$38/MWH for solar. Wind is \$37/MWH. Coal produces more soot in the air, even with costly scrubbers, and increases the blanket of smoke around the earth that is increasing its temperature daily.
