ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO EXTEND
THE PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

ISSUED: April 7, 2026

On March 5, 2026, the Public Service Commission (PSC) issued its Order Granting Motions to Suspend Schedule and Discovery (“Prior Order”), granting Rocky Mountain Power’s (RMP) motion to suspend the schedule to allow parties an opportunity to discuss the ramifications of a significant sale of RMP’s assets located in Washington and the attendant effect on this proceeding. The Prior Order directed the parties to confer and file, by April 7, 2026, a stipulated amended schedule. If consensus could not be reached, the PSC directed RMP to request the PSC set a scheduling conference.

On April 1, 2026, Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) filed its Motion to Extend the Procedural Schedule (“Motion”), explaining the parties required an additional 30 days to discuss and develop a schedule. RMP represents in the Motion that it has contacted the other parties, and none opposes the extension.

There being no opposition and good cause otherwise appearing, the Motion is granted. The PSC asks the parties to file a stipulated schedule on or before **Thursday, May 7, 2026**. If the parties cannot reach a consensus, the PSC asks RMP to notify the PSC and request it set the matter for a scheduling conference.
