Dear Commissioners -

I write in support of Utah Clean Energy's request for agency action. Energy production is key to Utah's strong economic growth, and Utah's energy demand is rising. New data centers, a growing population, a strong economy, and increasing electrification all point in the direction of higher electricity demand - while at the same time older generation assets pose an increasing risk of retirement or lengthy maintenance events. It is a given that new generation will be needed in the state. Much of this new electricity generation will be supplied by wind, solar, batteries, and geothermal regardless of whether it happens this year or over the next decade. It is clearly in Utah's interest and in the ratepayers' interest to begin construction as soon as possible on those assets to take advantage of federal tax credits before they expire. I hope that you'll consider granting the request for expedited action to benefit from those cost savings.
