William J Lockhart 1933-2024

Salt Lake City, UT—Bill Lockhart, love of wild places shaped who he became, both personally and professionally. Early in life, Bill enjoyed riding his horse "Pal" through the orchards and woodlands around his home in California and later, fishing and canoeing in Minnesota's Boundary Waters.

After graduating from the University of Minnesota, Bill worked for the U.S. Forest Service and joined the Navy, serving three years, including two on a destroyer in the Asia Pacific. After his military service, he worked as a teacher where he served as editor-in-chief and president of the Minnesota State Review.

After a few years in private practice, Bill was offered a faculty position at the University of Utah College of Law. Drawn by the open lands of the west, he moved his young family to Utah in 1964 and began what would become a nearly half-century-long academic career. Bill taught constitutional, administrative, and public lands law and mentored generations of students committed to protecting the environment. He was more than a few years honored him with the moniker "Wild Bill."

After divorcing, Bill married Terri Martin in 1990. They shared a love of the outdoors and became active in national parks and adjacent public lands. They welcomed daughter Zoey in 1992. The family lived in India twice during the 2000s, when Bill was awarded Fulbright fellowships to study the protection of the country's national parks and wildlife.

Bill provided pro bono advocacy for many organizations and was recognized for his contributions with awards for Outstanding Civil Rights Work (1968), the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance Wildlands Preservation Award (1989) and the Utah Bar Association for Distinguished Service in the Environmental Law (1998), among others.

Bill is survived by his children Laura, Bill (Jill Schwartz), Ann (Ed Crocker), and Zoey Martin-Lockhart, former in the U.S. Environmental Law and grandchildren Maisey Phelps and Eva Sophia Crocker. A private memorial will be held at a later date.
