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Re: *Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 97, Wildfire Mitigation Balancing Account*; Docket No. 26-035-T05

Dear Mr. Backlund:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the April 9, 2026 filing ("Filing") by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 97, Wildfire Mitigation Balancing Account¹ ("Schedule 97 Revisions").² RMP requests the surcharge for the Wildfire Mitigation Balancing Account be set to zero, effective May 15, 2026.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on April 27, 2026 ("DPU Comments"). No other comments were filed.

The DPU recommends approval of the Schedule 97 Revisions, effective May 22, 2026.³ The DPU describes evaluating five scenarios modifying the effective date of the Schedule 97 Revisions to determine when the balance would be close to zero. The DPU states that the remaining balance in the account, assuming an effective date of May 15 would be \$170,774.60. If the Schedule 97 Revisions are deemed effective May 22, 2026, the remaining balance would be \$4,480.09. Additionally, the DPU notes that

the ending balance is dependent on “the nature of a volumetric rate and the associated complexity of the system to implement the surcharge, the numerous starts and stops of service, fluctuations of customer habits, weather changes, etc. would make it next to impossible to arrive at a balance of zero.”⁴

RMP filed reply comments on May 4, 2026 and agreed with the DPU's recommendation to change the effective date of the Schedule 97 Revisions to May 22, 2026.

The PSC appreciates the DPU's careful review of RMP's proposed Schedule 97 Revisions. Based on the Filing, the comments and recommendations from the DPU, and RMP's reply comments, the Schedule 97 Revisions are approved, effective May 22, 2026.
