Re: Docket No. 26-035-T07 – *Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service*

Dear Mr. Backlund:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed the June 1, 2026, filing ("Filing") submitted by Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) proposing revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 135, Net Metering Service, Sheet No. 135.4 ("Tariff Revisions") in compliance with the PSC's February 12, 2009, Report and Order Directing Tariff Modifications in Docket No. 08-035-78 ("2009 Order"). The Tariff Revisions update the valuation of net excess generation credits for large non-residential Net Metering customers to reflect the average retail rates for the previous year's Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Form No. 1.

The PSC has also reviewed the June 8, 2026, comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). No other comments were filed in this docket. DPU reviewed the Filing for variances between the values provided and those reported in the previously filed FERC Form 1. DPU found no variance, confirming that the schedule totals underlying the credit rates are accurate. DPU notes that the only identifiable difference arises within the "Schedule Not Used" category, which captures Street and Highway Lighting, Irrigation, and other revenues. These revenues are excluded from

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the rate determination and do not affect the proposed credits. As such, DPU finds the Filing to be accurate and the derived rates correct. DPU states that the filing complies with the 2009 Order and the proposed revisions are just, reasonable, and in the public interest and recommends the PSC approve the Tariff Revisions, effective July 1, 2026.

Based on the PSC's review of the Filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves the Tariff Revisions as filed, effective July 1, 2026.
