Thank you for your response, I assume this is a somewhat 'canned' response as I did not argue that the price should be increased, I realize that the price at the pump should reflect what is costs to deliver it. I think Questar should have to provide ALL costs to maintain the pumps to be able to charge this additional amount. I believe that most the current pumps were installed with grants, which costs should not be passed on to the consumers (since grant money usually comes from taxes we already paid!!)
