Re: Docket No. 16-057-04, In the Matter of Questar Gas Company's Energy Efficiency Reports

Dear Mr. Parker,

On March 22, 2016, Questar Gas Company (Questar) filed its Energy Efficiency (EE) Report for the Year Ending December 31, 2015. On April 20, 2016, pursuant to the Commission's January 16, 2007 Order (January Order) in Docket No. 05-057-T01,¹ the Commission issued an action request to the Division of Public Utilities (Division) to review Questar's filing for compliance and to make recommendations.

On May 19, 2016, the Division filed a memorandum in response to the Commission's action request (Memorandum). The Division's Memorandum compares budgeted and actual spending, and provides analysis of the cost effectiveness for each of the components of Questar's EE Program. The Division notes the benefit/cost ratio for the Total Resource Cost Test for all EE programs is 0.9. The Division requests that the Company discuss the EE Report's results and the trends for the EE program at a future 2016 Advisory Group meeting. On May 23, 2016, the Commission issued a Notice of Filing and Comment Period, inviting comments and reply comments on the Division's Memorandum by June 20, 2016, and June 27, 2016, respectively. No comments were filed.

The Commission commends the Division for its comprehensive analysis and concludes the Division's Memorandum complies with the January Order. The Commission encourages Questar and the DSM Advisory Group to examine the cost effectiveness of the energy efficiency programs going forward. The Commission supports the Division's continuing efforts to work
