Re: Docket No. 16-057-17, Questar Gas Company's Replacement Infrastructure 2017 Annual Plan and Budget

Dear Mr. Jetter,

On October 4, 2017, the Public Service Commission (“PSC”) received correspondence (“Letter”) from an anonymous source making allegations against individuals at a local utility and a named contractor working on behalf of the utility. On October 25, 2017, the PSC provided the Letter to parties of the above-referenced docket. On November 1, 2017, the Division of Public Utilities (“DPU”) filed a Motion for Temporary Protective Order, pursuant to Utah Admin. Codes r.746-1-301 and r.746-1-601. According to the DPU, “the presence of anonymous, uninvestigated claims in the public record threatens reputational harm to the utility, at least one prominent officer, and a third-party. It is in the public interest to maintain the allegations confidentially until the Division reports its investigatory findings.”

The PSC makes no findings with respect to whether the document qualifies for highly confidential treatment, but based on the DPU’s concerns, the PSC will treat the Letter as highly confidential. The Letter has been removed from the PSC website, subject to the PSC’s future adjudication in the event any party objects.
