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Formal Complaint of Brett Robinson and Brad  
Crookston against Dominion Energy Utah

ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT

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ISSUED: January 23, 2019

On September 27, 2018, Complainants Brett Robinson and Brad Crookston (“Complainants”) filed a formal complaint (“Complaint”) with the Public Service Commission (“PSC”) against Dominion Energy Utah (“DEU”). The Complaint explains the Complainants disagree with the route DEU proposed with respect to a Gas Main Extension in their development and disagree with DEU’s policy as regards such extensions. The Complaint requests DEU “adjust [its] proposal.”

The PSC established a period for the parties to file comments, which the parties subsequently stipulated to extend. On November 2, 2018, DEU filed its Response to the Complaint and moved to dismiss it (the “Motion”), representing “[t]o the knowledge of [DEU], all disputed matters have been resolved.” The Motion further represented Complainants had executed a Main Extension Agreement, paid in full for the installation of the Gas Main Line, and that construction had commenced. On November 13, 2018, Complainants filed a Reply disputing that all issues had been resolved.

On December 11, 2018, the PSC issued a Notice of Status and Scheduling Conference, explaining that “having reviewed the [Motion] and Reply, the PSC finds ambiguity exists as to whether and what issues remain to be resolved” and setting a status and scheduling conference (“Status Conference”) for December 20, 2018.

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At the Status Conference, Complainants and DEU agreed Complainants had executed a Main Extension Agreement and paid DEU in full for the installation. Complainants and DEU further agreed construction of the Gas Main Line at issue is now complete.

The PSC understands Complainants dislike DEU's policy with respect to gas main extensions, but they have not alleged DEU violated the policy or that it has violated any provision of statute, tariff, or rule. Additionally, the Gas Main Line, which is the subject of the Complaint, has now been installed. Because no allegation exists that DEU violated any provision of statute, rule, tariff, or policy and further because the PSC cannot identify any issue within the jurisdiction of the PSC that remains to be resolved, the PSC grants the Motion without prejudice.
