Pursuant to Public Service Commission (PSC) Second Hazardous Facility Order, Dead Horse Oil Company has removed all natural gas in the pipeline on February 8th, 2020. The pressure of the pipeline is now 0 psi.

The Paradox Pipeline no longer has any natural gas in its system, as the pipeline pressure is zero ("0"). All valves into and out of the pipeline are sealed and cannot be opened. natural gas belonging to Wesco, which has been flaring gas since June 2019, while wells operated by Pacific initially vented the gas and thereafter have been shut. There are no other sources of natural gas that are or could potentially use the pipeline.

Further, Dead Horse Oil Company objects to the Second Hazardous Facility Order against "current and future operator(s) and owner(s) of the subject pipeline." Dead Horse Oil Company nor were the pipeline's owners named in the original complaint filed with the PSC. Dead Horse Oil Company and the owners are being denied their due process since the Public Safety Division file its complaint against Pacific Energy and Mining Company, now in bankruptcy. Neither Dead Horse nor the owners were named or ordered to appear at any of the hearings, thus the Commission is a violation of its own rules.
