Dear Mr. Mendenhall:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Dominion Energy Utah's (DEU) July 14, 2022 filing of Updated Benefit-Cost Test Results for the 2021 EE Programs ("Updated Results"). The filing was made pursuant to the PSC's acknowledgment letter in the referenced Dockets dated May 3, 2022. The Updated Results provide updated benefit/cost test results for the total resource cost test, participant test, utility cost test, and ratepayer impact measure test (RIM).

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on August 10, 2022. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge DEU's Updated Results. In support of its recommendation, DPU comments that three out of the four metrics are above one, the exception being the RIM ratio. A score greater than one is indicative of the benefits exceeding costs. DPU also states that multiple metrics are well above one, suggesting that current rebates may need to be re-evaluated.

Based on the PSC's review of DEU's Updated Results and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges that DEU's Updated Results complies with the reporting requirements outlined in the May 3, 2022 acknowledgment letter.
