Re: *Dominion Energy Utah's Application for Approval of the 2022 Year Budget for Energy Efficiency Programs and Market Transformation Initiative, Docket No. 21-057-25; and Dominion Energy Utah's Energy Efficiency Reports, 2022, Docket No. 22-057-01*

Dear Mr. Mendenhall:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Dominion Energy Utah's (DEU) December 20, 2022 filing of a Report on Energy Efficiency Expenditures and Dekatherm Savings to Date ("Report"). The filing was made pursuant to reporting requirements set forth in the PSC's January 16, 2007 Order in Docket No. 05-057-T01 ("2007 Order").¹ The Report provides notice that (1) in November 2022, the Builder Program (BP) spending reached \$8.58 million, or 90.3% of its 2022 approved budget; and (2) the Low-Income Program (LP) spending reached \$0.69 million, or 92.3% of its 2022 approved budget in November 2022.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on January 19, 2023. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge DEU's Report. In support of its recommendation, DPU comments that DEU forecasts the BP and LP will use 100% of their respective budgets and that DEU does not anticipate exceeding the combined budget for all the energy efficiency programs. DPU also states that DEU will continue monitoring and managing participation for all of its energy efficiency programs.

Based on the PSC's review of DEU's Report and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges that DEU's Report complies with the reporting requirements described in the 2007 Order and 2021 Order.

¹ The filing was also filed pursuant to the directive in the PSC's January 29, 2021 Order in Docket No. 19-057-26 ("2021 Order") that "whenever the 90% threshold for any program is met DEU must promptly report the required information but not later than 45 days after which it identifies the issue based on prudent monthly monitoring of EE program expenditures." Order, at 5.
