Dear Mr. Mendenhall:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Dominion Energy Utah's (DEU) January 7, 2022 filing of a Report on Energy Efficiency Expenditures and Dekatherm Savings to Date ("Report"). The filing was made pursuant to reporting requirements set forth in the PSC's January 16, 2007 Order in Docket No. 05-057-T01 ("2007 Order") and a timing requirement described in the PSC's January 29, 2021 Order in Docket No. 19-057-26 ("2021 Order"). The Report provides notice that in November 2021 the Weatherization Program (WP) spending reached \$7.09 million, or 90.7%, of its 2021 approved budget of \$7.81 million, exceeding the 90% notification threshold set by the 2007 Order.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on February 3, 2022. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge DEU's Report. In support of its recommendation, DPU comments that DEU forecasts it will not spend 100% of the 2021 WP budget, and that all other energy efficiency programs are predicted to spend less than 100% of their annual budgets. DPU also states that DEU agrees to continue monitoring and managing participation for all of its energy efficiency programs.

Based on the PSC's review of DEU's Report and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges that DEU's Report complies with the reporting requirements described in the 2007 Order and 2021 Order.
