22	Q Mr. Mendenhall, please state your full name

24	A My name is Kelly B. Mendenhall, and my

1 City, Utah. What position do you hold with the company? 2. Q I'm the director of regulatory and pricing for 3 Α Dominion Energy Utah. 4 Did you participate in the preparation of the application in this matter as well as the negotiation of 6 the settlement stipulation we're here to discuss today? Α I did. 9 Can you summarize for the commission the 10 relief sought with that settlement stipulation? 11 I believe my testimony provides some background on why we're here today with this -- this 12 13 settlement, but just to give a brief overview, due to 14 some supply chain issues we've had over the last year, the part -- or the company found it important to clarify 15 the rules under which we would be able to transfer 16 17 inventory between affiliates. 18 And so if you turn to the settlement stipulation, the basis of this agreement is explained 19 2.0 there. Let's start -- really it's paragraphs 5 through 21 8. And I'll jump around a little bit, but paragraph 5 22 of the stipulation on page 3 basically says that this 23 stipulation does not shift any of the burden of the 24 company to provide evidence that the transfers were just and reasonable and prudent. So that burden of proof 25 Page 4

will still remain with the company.

Skipping down to paragraph 7, we agree that anytime we make an inventory transfer between an affiliate, that will be reported in our annual affiliate transaction report along with an explanation as to the amount of the transfer and why it was necessary.

Moving up to paragraph 6, in instances where the inventory transfers are over \$500,000, the company will notify the commission at the time of the inventory transfer and within -- within 30 days of the transfer.

And then moving down to paragraph 8, parties agree that we will follow the -- or comply with Utah Administrative Code R746-401-3. And just to summarize that piece of code, basically what it says is anytime the company transfers a sale or participates in the sale of an asset to an affiliate for an amount the lesser of 10 million or 5 percent of gross investment, we will file with the commission 30 days prior to that to receive commission approval.

So just to do the math there, 5 percent of our gross investment -- our gross investment right now is 3.1 billion, and so that would amount to about 158.6 million, so the lesser of 10 million or 158 million would be 10 million.

1	So basically to simplify this a little
2	bit, anytime we transfer inventory \$10 million or more,
3	we will file with the commission before that transfer to
4	get approval.
5	So those are the the important terms
6	of the settlement. The company believes that this is
7	just and reasonable and in the public interest, and we
8	ask that the commission approve it. Thank you.
9	MS. CLARK: Mr. Mendenhall's available
10	for cross-examination or commission questions.
11	THE COURT: Ms. Schmid?
12	MS. SCHMID: No questions. Thank you.
13	THE COURT: And I have none. Thank you,

A Thank you.
On August 5th, 2022, the division filed
its action request response recommending that the
commission approve Dominion's application only if
certain conditions were met.
This filing requested commission approval
of a limited purpose agreement that would allow the
company to transfer inventory items to and from its
affiliated sister companies without requiring the
company to seek commission approval each time.
The proposed agreement would potentially
place a company and its affiliates in a position similar
to the position gas affiliates enjoy through the use of
mutual aid agreements.
Currently there are regulatory rules,
tariff provisions, and merger agreements that may, but
not necessarily, place boundaries around intercompany
assets and/or inventory transfers like the ones
initially proposed in the agreement, which the division
cites in its action request response.
Also in that same memo the division noted
that there may be customer benefits and smooth
Page 8

1 intercompany inventory transfers. However, in its then 2 current state, the proposed agreement was not in the 3 public interest unless certain conditions were met regarding the evidentiary burden of the company, the 4 5 propriety and need of the transfer, the demonstration that Utah customers were held harmless. 6 Evidence provided that the item -- items transferred to the Utah utility were received at the 8 9 lower of cost or market and that no asset or inventory 10 transfer exceed \$10 million without preapproval by the 11 commission. The division has always been supportive 12 13 of the concept of utilities mutual aid agreements. 14 division sees the practicality of an agreement like the 15 one proposed, which arguably could be met with the 16 current mutual aid agreements, but that an agreement such as this might provide an additional regulatory 17 18 transparency. Following the filing of the division's 19 2.0 memo, settlement discussions were held. The company has 21 satisfactorily adopted the conditions recommended in the 22 division's action request response. Therefore, the 23 division has agreed to the stipulation filed on 24 August 19, 2022, which represents the best agreement

between the two parties.

1	The division recommends this stipulation				
2	and the attached gas affiliate inventory transfer				
3	agreement represented as settlement's Exhibit A in the				
4	filing be approved as it is now in the public interest				
5	and is just and reasonable in its result.
