2 P R O C E E D I N G S

3 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good morning,
4 everyone. My name is John Delaney. I'm the Commission's
5 designated presiding officer for this hearing.

6 For the record, today is December 13, 2022,
7 and it is approximately 9 A.M., and this is the date and
8 time that is scheduled for the consolidated hearing on
9 two dockets. The first docket is Docket No. 22-057-20,
10 the corrected pass-through application of Dominion Energy
11 for an adjustment in rates and charges for natural gas
12 service in Utah. This is a corrected application. One
13 word was changed.

14 Thank you for filing that.

15 And this second docket is 220 -- or -057-21,
16 and that's the application of Dominion Energy for an
17 adjustment to the daily transportation imbalance charge.

18 We have -- before we take appearances, I'm
19 wearing a mask because I'm coming down off of a cold, and
20 just to be safe.

21 We also have remotely the court reporter, so
22 what we'd like to do, when we have witnesses and when
23 counsel make their appearances, clearly articulate your
24 name every time that you introduce yourself or you get on
25 the stand. And then I'm going to ask the court reporter

1 to interrupt us as appropriate, if he or she -- she,
2 right? -- if she cannot hear us or if I'm going too fast.

3 Okay, Kellie? That was for you.

4 COURT REPORTER: Okay. Thank you.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. You're
6 welcome.

7 Let's do appearances. Start with the --

8 MS. CLARK: Thank you. My name is Jennifer
9 Clark. I'm counsel for Dominion Energy, and I have with
10 me, Jessica Ipson and Jesse Jackson, who will serve as
11 the Company's witnesses today.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

13 MS. SCHMID: Good morning, Patricia Schmid
14 with the Utah Attorney General's Office, on behalf of the
15 Division of Public Utilities.

16 The Division has two witnesses today, one for
17 each docket. The Division's witness in Docket No.
18 22-057-20 is Russell Cazier. He will spell his name when
19 he is on the stand.

20 And the Division's witness for 22-057-21 is
21 Ryan Daigle, and he also will spell his name when he's on
22 the stand. Thank you.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

24 Any preliminary matters before we get going?

25 Okay. Ms. Clark, if you would like to call

1 your first witness, in let's -- in Docket -20.

2 MS. CLARK: The Company calls Jessica Ipson.

3 MS. IPSON: Good morning.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good morning,
5 Ms. Ipson.

6 DIRECT EXAMINATION

7 JESSICA IPSON,

8 called as a witness, having been first duly sworn,
9 was examined and testified as follows:

10 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

11 BY MS. CLARK:

12 Q. Ms. Ipson, can you please state your name and
13 business address for the record?

14 A. My name is Jessica Ipson; business address is
15 333 South State Street, Salt Lake City, Utah.

16 Q. What position do you hold with the company?

17 A. I am a regulatory specialist.

18 Q. Ms. Ipson, the Company has filed a corrected
19 application, along with accompanying Exhibits 1.1 through
20 1.8.

21 Did you prepare or cause to be prepared each
22 of these documents?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And do you adopt their contents as your
25 testimony today?

1 A. Yes.

2 MS. CLARK: The Company moves for the
3 admission of the application and accompanying exhibits.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Any objection?

5 Okay. Motion granted.

6 MS. CLARK: Thank you.

7 BY MS. CLARK:

8 Q. Ms. Ipson, can you please summarize the
9 relief the Company seeks today?

10 A. Yes. In pass-through Docket No. 22-057-20,
11 Dominion Energy respectfully asks the Utah Public Service
12 Commission for approval of \$775,037,208 in Utah gas cost
13 coverage. This represents an overall decrease of
14 72,685,322.

15 The components of this decrease are, first, a
16 decrease of \$71,165,228 in commodity cost; and second, a
17 decrease of \$1,520,094 in supplier non-gas cost. The
18 decrease being proposed is due to lower forecasted gas
19 cost for the test period.

20 This request includes the amortization of the
21 commodity portion of actual August 22 under-collected 191
22 balance of \$61,126,894 by a 15 -- excuse me, by a 53.23
23 cent per dekatherm debit surcharge. RIN proceeds of
24 \$114,874 were generated through the company's CNG
25 station, decreasing the NGV class commodity by a credit

1 of 39.643 cents per dekatherm.

2 The Company is also requesting to continue to
3 amortize the under-collected SNG cost of \$3,222,746,
4 which leads to the debit amortization charges shown on
5 Exhibit 1.5, page 6.

6 The cost of purchase gas was developed using
7 forecasted gas prices from S&P Global plats and IHS
8 Markit. If this application is approved, a typical Utah
9 GS customer, using 70 dekatherms per year, would see a
10 decrease of \$44.15, or an annual decrease of about 5.3
11 percent.

12 These rates are just, reasonable, and in the
13 public interest. Therefore, we request the rates
14 proposed in commodity and SNG be allowed to go into
15 effect on January 1, 2023, on an interim basis.

16 MS. CLARK: Ms. Ipson is now available for
17 cross-examination and the hearing officer's questions.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

19 Ms. Schmid, any --

20 MS. SCHMID: No questions.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. I don't
22 have any questions either.

23 Thank you very much.

24 A. Thank you.

25 MS. CLARK: Thank you.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Would you like to
2 call your first witness?

3 MS. SCHMID: Yes. The Division's witness in
4 this docket is Russell Cazier. May he please be sworn?

5 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Yes.

6 Good morning, Mr. Cazier.

7 MR. CAZIER: Good morning.

8 DIRECT EXAMINATION

9 RUSSELL CAZIER,

10 called as a witness, having been first duly sworn,
11 was examined and testified as follows:

12 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Great, thank you.

13 BY MS. SCHMID:

14 Q. Can you please state and spell your full name
15 for the record?

16 A. It's R-U-S-S-E-L-L C-A-Z-I-E-R.

17 Q. By whom are you employed, and what is your
18 title?

19 A. Division of Public Utilities. I work as a
20 utility analyst.

21 Q. And your business address?

22 A. It is 160 East 300 South, Salt Lake City.

23 Q. Have you participated in this docket on
24 behalf of the Division?

25 A. Yes, I have.

1 Q. Did you prepare and cause to be filed or
2 participate in the preparation and filing of the
3 Division's action request response, dated December 1,
4 2022, in this docket?

5 A. I did.

6 Q. Do you have any changes or corrections to
7 that response?

8 A. I have one correction. It should be noted on
9 the final page of that, in my concluding paragraph in my
10 opening sentence, I stated that the company has the
11 requirement to file pass-through at least twice a year.
12 And according to the tariff, that is once -- it's once a
13 year.

14 Q. Thank you. With that correction, if you were
15 asked to prepare your Division action request response
16 today, would the contents be the same as those that were
17 filed?

18 A. Yes, they would.

19 Q. Do you adopt your action request response as
20 described above and corrected as part of your testimony
21 here today?

22 A. I do.

23 MS. SCHMID: The Division would like to move
24 for the admission of its action request response, dated
25 December 1, 2022, in this docket.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Any objection,
2 Ms. Clark?

3 MS. CLARK: No objection.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. The motion
5 is granted.

6 BY MS. SCHMID:

7 Q. Mr. Cazier, do you have a summary to present
8 today?

9 A. I do.

10 Q. Please proceed.

11 A. In Docket 22-057-20, or the 191 pass-through
12 application, Dominion requests approval to decrease the
13 commodity rates and charges for natural gas service by
14 72.6 million. The proposal includes a 71.1 million
15 decrease in the commodity portion of the rates, and a
16 decrease of 1.5 million in the supplier non-gas portion
17 of the rates.

18 The Company proposes to maintain the current
19 debit amortization of 53 cents per dekatherm on the
20 under-collected balance in the commodity portion of the
21 191 account. The driving force behind the requested
22 commodity price decrease is lower forecasted natural gas
23 costs for the test year ending December 31, 2023.

24 This filing consists of cost of service gas
25 from Wexpro, contracted merchant -- contract and market

1 purchases, partial filling of the LNG storage tank, and
2 other storage and transportation costs.

3 The proposed rates represent a decrease of 14
4 cents per dekatherm in the cost of service gas, and a
5 decrease of 94 cents per dekatherm for contract and
6 market purchase gas, as compared to the September 30th,
7 2022, filing.

8 If this application is approved, a typical GS
9 residential customer, using 70 dekatherms per year, will
10 see a decrease in their total annual bill of \$44.15 or
11 5.30 percent. Residential customers, using 80 dekatherms
12 per year, will see a decrease in their total annual bill
13 of \$50.46 or 5.36 percent.

14 The Division has reviewed Dominion's
15 application and finds the proposed rate decrease to be
16 just and reasonable for Utah customers, and recommends
17 the Commission approve the rates -- the rate changes on
18 an interim basis, with the proposed effective date of
19 January 1, 2023.

20 This concludes my summary.

21 Q. Thank you.

22 MS. SCHMID: Mr. Cazier is now available for
23 questions from Dominion and from the hearing office.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

25 Mr. Clark?

1 MS. CLARK: I have no questions, thanks.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: I have no
3 questions either.

4 Thank you, Mr. Cazier.

5 A. Thank you.

6 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. How about
7 we'll move on to the next docket, Docket 22-057-21.

8 Mr. Clark, if you would like to call your
9 witness?

10 MS. CLARK: Thank you so much.

11 The Company calls Jesse Jackson.

12 MR. JACKSON: Good morning.

13 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good morning,
14 Mr. Jackson.

15 DIRECT EXAMINATION

16 JESSE JACKSON,

17 called as a witness, having been first duly sworn,
18 was examined and testified as follows:

19 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

20 BY MS. CLARK:

21 Q. Mr. Jackson, please state your name and
22 business address for the record.

23 A. My name is Jesse Jackson. My business
24 address is 333 South State Street, Salt Lake City, Utah.

25 Q. And what position do you hold with the

1 Company?

2 A. I'm a regulatory specialist.

3 Q. Mr. Jackson, the Company has submitted an
4 application, with accompanying Exhibits 1.1 through 1.3.

5 Did you either prepare or caused to be
6 prepared each of those documents?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And do you adopt their constants as your
9 testimony today?

10 A. Yes, I do.

11 Q. Can you please summarize the relief the
12 Company requests in this docket?

13 A. Yes. In this docket, the Company requests an
14 adjustment to the transportation imbalance charge to
15 appropriately collect costs associated with
16 managing -- is it working?

17 Okay. Sorry about that. In this docket, the
18 Company requests an adjustment to the transportation
19 imbalance charge to appropriately collect costs
20 associated with managing imbalance dekatherms transported
21 on the Company's distribution system.

22 The proposed imbalance charge reflects cost
23 borne by the Company to manage net imbalance dekatherm of
24 transportation service customers, divided by the
25 imbalance dekatherms over the 5 percent tolerance

1 threshold.

2 The resolving imbalance rate of 8.7 cents is
3 8 percent lower than the previous transportation
4 imbalance charge. This charge will only be applied to
5 transportation service volumes, different from nomination
6 volumes by more than 5 percent.

7 The transportation imbalance charge continues
8 to serve its intended purpose, and is just, reasonable,
9 and in the public interest. The Company requests an
10 approval of these interim rates effective January 1,
11 2023.

12 And this concludes my summary.

13 MS. CLARK: Mr. Jackson is available for
14 cross-examination and the hearing officer's questions.

15 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

16 Ms. Schmid?

17 MS. SCHMID: Could I have just one moment,
18 please?

19 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Sure.

20 MS. SCHMID: Thank you.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: In the meantime,
22 Ms. Nelson, did you want to move to have the exhibits --

23 MS. CLARK: Yes, please. Thank you.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Any objection,
25 Ms. Schmid, on the exhibits?

1 MS. SCHMID: No objection.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. The motion
3 is granted.

4 MS. SCHMID: I'm ready. Thank you.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Yes,
6 please.

7 MS. SCHMID: No questions. Thank you.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: And I don't have
9 any questions either.

10 Thank you very much.

11 Ms. Schmid, sorry, your witness.

12 MS. SCHMID: The Division would like to call
13 Mr. Ryan Daigle as its witness. May he please be sworn?

14 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Yes.

15 Good morning, Mr. Daigle.

16 DIRECT EXAMINATION

17 RYAN DAIGLE,

18 called as a witness, having been first duly sworn,

19 was examined and testified as follows:

20 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you very
21 much.

22 BY MS. SCHMID:

23 Q. Could you please state and spell your full
24 name for the record?

25 A. Ryan Daigle, R-Y-A-N D-A-I-G-L-E.

1 Q. By whom are you employed, and what is your
2 title?

3 A. The Division of Public Utilities, and I'm an
4 utility analyst.

5 Q. What is your business address?

6 A. 160 East 300 South, Salt Lake, Utah 84114.

7 Q. Have you participated -- on behalf of this
8 docket, have you participated on this docket on behalf of
9 the Division?

10 A. I have.

11 Q. Did you prepare or cause to be filed, or
12 participate in the preparation and filing of the
13 Division's action request in this docket, dated December
14 1, 2022?

15 A. Yes, I did.

16 Q. Do you have any changes or corrections to
17 that response?

18 A. I do not.

19 Q. If you were asked to prepare and file the
20 action request response today, would the contents be the
21 same as contained in your filed request?

22 A. Yes, it would.

23 Q. Do you adopt your action request response, as
24 described above, as part of your testimony here today?

25 A. Yes, I do.

1 MS. SCHMID: With that, the Division would
2 like to move for the admission of its action request
3 response in this docket, dated December 1, 2022.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

5 Any objection, Ms. Clark?

6 MS. CLARK: No objection. Thank you.

7 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Your
8 motion is granted.

9 MS. SCHMID: Thank you.

10 BY MS. SCHMID:

11 Q. Mr. Daigle, do you have a summary to share
12 with us today?

13 A. I do.

14 Q. Please proceed.

15 A. Thank you.

16 Good morning. Transportation imbalance
17 charge was established to charge transportation customers
18 for the supplier non-gas services, which are being used
19 on the Company's natural gas distribution network.

20 The calculation of this rate is based on the
21 methodology approved in Docket No. 14-057-31, and is to
22 be adjusted with each pass-through filing and in the
23 general rate case.

24 This is the third adjustment in 2022, and
25 with this docket, the proposed adjustment represents a

1 change from 9.449 cents to 8.699 cents per dekatherm, and
2 is calculated based on the actual volumes of gas used by
3 the transportation customers for the 12 months ending
4 October 31, 2022.

5 This rate applies to customers who are taking
6 service under the transportation rate schedules, and any
7 amount collected is credited to the GS customers through
8 the 191 account. This transportation imbalance charge
9 rate does not impact all transportation customers, and
10 applies only when customers' nominations are outside of a
11 5 percent daily tolerance limit. Transportation
12 customers can minimize or entirely avoid the
13 transportation imbalance charge through accurate daily
14 gas nominations.

15 Based on our initial review, the Division
16 believes that the requested changes and proposed rate and
17 changes be approved on an interim basis until a full
18 audit review of the 191 account can be completed.

19 As a follow-up from the previous
20 transportation imbalance hearing, we have met with the
21 Company, and there were assurances provided that the
22 transportation imbalance charge is acting as it should,
23 and the daily imbalances are not affecting the gas
24 distribution network.

25 This concludes my summary. Thank you.

1 Q. Just one question: Is it the Division's
2 position that on an interim basis, the proposed rate is
3 just, reasonable, and in the public interest?

4 A. It is.

5 Q. Thank you.

6 MS. SCHMID: Mr. Daigle is now available for
7 cross-examination questions and questions from the
8 hearing officer.

9 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

10 Ms. Clark?

11 MS. CLARK: I have no questions. Thanks.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. I have no
13 questions either.

14 MS. SCHMID: Thank you. The Division has
15 nothing further in either of these dockets.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. All right.
17 Well, I believe that's it. So we will have an order
18 issued by January 1st, and that's the deadline so we will
19 have it done by then.

20 Does anybody have anything else? Okay.
21 Well, thanks for accommodating the 9 o'clock schedule and
22 thanks for being here. Thank you.

23 MS. SCHMID: Thank you.

24 (The hearing was concluded at 9:20 A.M.)


