Re: *Dominion Energy Utah's Application for Approval of the 2023 Year Budget for Energy Efficiency Programs and Market Transformation Initiative, Docket No. 22-057-18; and Dominion Energy Utah's Energy Efficiency Reports, 2024, Docket No. 24-057-01*

Dear Mr. Orton:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Dominion Energy Utah's (DEU) January 16, 2024 filing of a Report on Energy Efficiency expenditures and Dekatherm (Dth) Savings to Date ("Report"). The filing was made pursuant to reporting requirements set forth in the PSC's January 12, 2010 Order in Docket No. 09-057-15 ("2010 Order"). The Report provides notice that in November 2023 the actual spending for the Builder and Low-Income Efficiency programs reached ninety percent (90%) of the respective 2023 program budgets. Additionally, the Report states DEU forecasts the (1) Builder Program will finish the year at one hundred and three percent (103%) of the Commission-approved \$8.25 million 2023 budget, and (2) Weatherization Program will finish the year at one hundred and two percent (102%) of the PSC-approved \$7.7 million 2023 budget.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on February 13, 2024. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge DEU's Report complies with the 2010 Order as well as acknowledge DEU's Report of the ThermWise® Builder and Low-Income Programs spending of its relative budgets. DPU did not make any recommendations regarding whether the expenses that exceeded the 2023 budgets should be approved.

Based on the PSC's review of DEU's Report and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges that DEU's Report complies with the reporting requirements described in the 2010 Order. The PSC intends to issue a Notice of Filing

and Comment Period to provide interested parties an opportunity to comment on whether to approve the program expenses that exceeded the PSC-approved Builder and Weatherization Program 2023 budgets.
