Re: *Enbridge Gas Utah's Application for Approval of the 2025 Year Budget for Energy Efficiency Programs and Market Transformation Initiative*, Docket No. 24-057-22; and *Enbridge Gas Utah's Energy Efficiency Reports, 2025*, Docket No. 25-057-05

Dear Mr. Summers:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Enbridge Gas Utah's (EGU, formerly Dominion Energy Utah) July 15, 2025 filing of its Report on Demand Side Management Expenditures to Date ("DSM Expenditure Report").<sup>1</sup> The DSM Expenditure Report states that EGU's Weatherization Program, MTI Program, and Builder Program reached sixty-three percent (63%), fifty-five percent (55%), and fifty-six percent (56%), respectively, of their allocated 2025 budget for the prior to June 30 period. On July 21, 2025, the PSC issued a Notice of Filing and Comment Period seeking comments on the DSM Expenditure Report. No reply comments were filed.

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU) submitted comments on August 12, 2025. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge EGU's DSM Expenditure Report. DPU represents, "[t]he Company also forecasts that the ThermWise programs in total will not exceed the 2025 Commission-approved budget of \$30.1 million" and "[it] will continue to

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<sup>1</sup> EGU is required to file a report with the PSC when any DSM program costs reached ninety percent (90%) of its budget, and if any DSM program costs reached fifty percent (50%) of its budget before June 30 each year, or if any DSM program costs are eighty percent (80%) of the budget by August. 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monitor the DSM program activity and expenditures by reviewing the detailed quarterly reports.”<sup>2</sup>

Based on the PSC’s review and DPU’s comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges the Weatherization Program, MTI Program, and Builder Program expenses exceeded their respective PSC-approved 2025 budget prior to June 30. Additionally, the PSC acknowledges the DSM Expenditure Report.
