Re: *Enbridge Gas Utah's Application for Approval of the 2025 Year Budget for Energy Efficiency Programs and Market Transformation Initiative, Docket No. 24-057-22; Enbridge Gas Utah's Energy Efficiency Reports, 2026, Docket No. 26-057-01*

Dear Mr. Orton:

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed Enbridge Gas Utah's (EGU) (formerly, Dominion Energy Utah) January 14, 2026 filing of its Report on Energy Efficiency Expenditures and Dekatherm Savings to Date ("DSM Expenditures Report").¹ The DSM Expenditures Report states that the "Builder, Low-Income, and Energy Comparison Report (ECR) Programs reached ninety-five percent (95.1%), ninety percent (90.7%), and ninety percent (90.7%) of the respective 2025 program budgets." EGU explained that the Builder Program has experienced higher participation in the Pay-for-Performance measures for both single and multifamily measures. It also explains that the Low-Income and ECR Programs have reached their levels of participation as of the end of November. EGU forecast that the Builder Program will finish the year at one hundred thirty-one percent (131%) of the PSC-approved \$9.81 million 2025 budget, and the Low-Income and ECR Programs will finish within the 2025 PSC-approved budget. Finally, EGU forecasts the ThermWise® programs in total will reach \$32.9 million, or one hundred six percent (106.8%) of the 2025 PSC-approved budget.

¹ EGU is required to file a DSM report when any DSM program reaches 90% of its annual budget, 50% of its annual budget before June, or 80% of its annual budget by August. See Docket No. 05-057-T01, Order, at 7 (issued January 16, 2007); Docket No. 09-057-15, Order, at 3 (issued January 12, 2010); and Docket No. 10-057-15, Report and Order, at 4 (issued January 12, 2011).

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DPU submitted comments on February 2, 2026. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge EGU's DSM Expenditures Report. DPU represents, "[t]he Company forecasts that the Builder Program will exceed its budget at one hundred-thirty-one percent (131%) of the Commission-approved \$9.81 million budget by year-end. The Low-Income Program budget will reach ninety-two percent (92%) of its Commission-approved \$0.74 million budget, and the ECR Program will reach ninety-eight percent (98%) of its Commission-approved \$0.52 million budget by year-end. The Company also forecasts that the ThermWise programs in total will exceed their 2025 Commission-approved budget of \$30.8 million, with actual spending at \$32.9 million or one-hundred-six percent (106%)."²

Based on the PSC's review and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges the Builder, Low-Income, and ECR Programs expenses exceeded 90% of their respective PSC-approved 2025 budgets and the DSM Expenditures Report complies with the PSC Order in Docket No. 05-057-T01.
