[On the record at 1:30 a.m.]

PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good afternoon, everybody. My name is John Delaney, and I'm the commission's designated presiding officer for this hearing.

Today is February 3rd, 2026, it's approximately 1:30 p.m., and this is the date and time that's scheduled for the hearing in Docket 25-057-21, the application of Enbridge Gas Utah to extend service to South Rim, Utah.

And we're here to address the settlement stipulation filed by the parties on January 26th, correct -- okay.

And I will note that I don't see anybody from the Office of Consumer Services here today, and I'll also note that there is something in the stipulation that addresses the Office of Consumer Services' position on the stipulation, which is non-opposition.

Okay. Why don't we start with appearances.

Mr. Cottam?

MR. COTTAM: Yes, good afternoon. My name is Dale Cottam. I'm an attorney with Bailey Stock Harman Cottam and Lopez, and I am outside counsel for the company Enbridge Gas Utah.

Here with me at the table is Jennifer Clark, senior assistant counsel for the company; Austin Summers, director of regulatory pricing; and Jordan Parks, senior regulatory

1 advisor. Mr. Parks will be testifying on behalf of the company
2 and in favor of the stipulation.

3 We also have with us here in the room Will Radford,
4 manager of engineering, and Terry Workman, region manager, both
5 of whom submitted pre-filed direct testimony, and they are
6 available to testify in person if needed.

7 And then finally, monitoring virtually, we have
8 Kendall Thomas, a Tooele County councilman who submitted pre-
9 filed testimony. And Councilman Thomas is available by phone
10 to answer questions if they arise.

11 Thank you.

12 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you very much.

13 For the Division.

14 MS. SCHMID: Good afternoon. My name is Patricia E.
15 Schmid. I'm an assistant attorney general representing the
16 Division of Public Utilities.

17 The Division's witness today is Ms. Savannah Torman.
18 She will be speaking in support of the stipulation. The
19 Division has no other witnesses.

20 Thank you.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Great. Welcome,
22 everybody, and everybody out there, too.

23 Okay. Preliminary matters:

24 As those of you who are here this morning heard me
25 say, I'll say it again, we have a live and in-person court

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1 reporter, Spencer, with us today. So please speak directly
2 into the microphone when speaking, making sure it's on first.
3 Speak clearly and speak at an appropriate pace. And I'm
4 directing Spencer to interrupt me or anybody else who violates
5 those rules so he can get a good record; okay?

6 I'll also note, as I did this morning, that no
7 surrebuttal was filed by either the DPU or EGU. And I'm
8 assuming that was intentional; is that correct?

9 MR. COTTAM: On behalf of the company, that is
10 correct.

11 MS. SCHMID: On behalf of the Division, it was
12 correct.

13 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Great. Any preliminary
14 matters from the parties?

15 Please, Mr. Cottam.

16 MR. COTTAM: Yes, thank you.

17 On behalf of the company, I move for admission of the
18 application, the accompanying exhibits, the rebuttal testimony
19 of Jordan Parks, and also the settlement stipulation, all of
20 which have been filed in the docket in this case.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Great. Any objection to
22 that motion?

23 MS. SCHMID: No objection.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Motion is granted. It's
25 admitted.

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1 [Company documents admitted.]

2 MS. SCHMID: At this time, the Division would like to
3 make a similar motion.

4 The Division requests that the direct testimony of
5 Ms. Savannah Torman, along with its exhibits 1.01 through 1.04
6 be admitted into evidence. This testimony was filed in both
7 redacted and confidential form.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. I'm not going to
9 be going over the confidential stuff, so any objection?

10 MR. COTTAM: No objection.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. The motion is
12 granted. It's admitted.

13 [Ms. Torman testimony and exhibits admitted.]

14 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Mr. Cottam, if you'd like
15 to call your first witness?

16 MR. COTTAM: Yes, thank you. On behalf of the
17 company, we would call Mr. Jordan Parks.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good afternoon, Mr.
19 Parks. I'm going to swear you in again.

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JORDAN PARKS,

a witness herein, having been administered an oath,
was examined and testified as follows.

PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Mr. Cottam, please
proceed.

MR. COTTAM: Thank you.

EXAMINATION

BY MR. COTTAM:

Q. Good afternoon, Mr. Parks.

A. Good afternoon.

Q. Would you please state your name and business address
for the record?

A. Yeah. Jordan Parks, 333 South State Street, Salt
Lake City, Utah.

Q. And are you the same Jordan Parks who submitted pre-
filed and rebuttal testimony in this matter?

A. Yes.

Q. And was the application filed in this docket prepared
by you or under your direction?

A. Yes, it was.

Q. And prior to the hearing today, was the company
successful in reaching a settlement stipulation with the
Division of Public Utilities?

A. It was, yes.

Q. Would you please now go ahead and summarize the

1 stipulation and describe the relief that the company is seeking
2 in this docket?

3 A. Yes. Good afternoon, Mr. Delaney, and thank you for
4 your time today. Before I begin, I want to thank the staff of
5 the Division of Public Utilities for their help and feedback in
6 making this settlement possible.

7 In this docket, Enbridge Gas seeks commission
8 approval to extend natural gas service to the rural community
9 of South Rim. This would be new infrastructure in a new rural
10 community. This resource decision is a continuation of the
11 program that was approved in the Eureka, Goshen, Green River,
12 Genola, and Portage dockets.

13 The financial effect of this expansion on a typical
14 customer using 70 dekatherms a year would be about \$1.54 or
15 0.24 percent. But to be clear, this increase will not affect
16 customers until the project is complete and the company seeks
17 rate recovery.

18 I will note that the company has concurrently filed a
19 separate application in Docket Number 25-057-20 to extend
20 service to the rural community of Fairfield. The cumulative
21 impact of both projects on a typical customer using 70
22 dekatherms a year would be about \$2.11 or 0.33 percent.

23 The application and accompanying testimony provided
24 all of the evidence required to support approval of this
25 resource decision.

1 In my pre-filed direct testimony, I addressed the
2 evidentiary requirements for this resource decision, discussed
3 how and why the company chose South Rim as the next expansion
4 location, explained how many customers are expected to
5 participate, how costs would be recovered, and provided other
6 relevant financial and operational information.

7 Mr. Radford's testimony explains the scope of the
8 project, the construction schedule, the cost of the project,
9 and the geographic results of the community's interest in
10 natural gas.

11 Mr. Workman's testimony discussed the process of
12 converting appliances to natural gas, the disposal of propane
13 equipment, and the safety benefits of being an Enbridge Gas
14 customer.

15 Finally, Councilman Thomas described the community
16 growth in South Rim, the benefits natural gas would bring to
17 this community, and explained his support of this project.

18 Taken together, the evidence provided shows that the
19 resource decision is just and reasonable in result, and that
20 approval of the application is in the public interest.

21 The settlement stipulation largely accepts the
22 company's proposal as filed. There are a few additional
23 provisions, and I will draw your attention to paragraph 6
24 through 13 of the settlement stipulation:

25 Paragraph 6 states that Enbridge Gas should be

1 authorized to construct the facilities proposed in the
2 application to serve the community of South Rim.

3 Paragraph 7 explains that the cost of the expansion
4 will be collected through the rural expansion rate adjustment
5 tracker that is contained in Section 9.02 of the company's
6 tariff.

7 Paragraph 8 states that the company will file a copy
8 of all permits, the franchise agreement, and other similar
9 items with the commission once they are finalized and executed.

10 Paragraph 9 explains that if the costs of the
11 resource decision exceed the estimates provided in the
12 testimony of Mr. Radford, the company will seek Commission
13 approval of the excess costs prior to including those costs in
14 the tracker. Approval of any increase will be subject to the
15 statutory spending caps discussed in my direct testimony.

16 Paragraph 10 states that the company will work with
17 South Rim and Tooele County officials to ensure that appliance
18 inspections by Tooele County are occurring before a meter is
19 set.

20 Paragraph 11 explains that prior to filing any future
21 rural expansion applications, the company will meet with the
22 Division to review and discuss the data supporting such
23 applications.

24 Paragraph 12 provides that beginning in 2027, the
25 company will file an annual report by March 1st of each year

1 providing five years of data on previously approved rural
2 expansion projects, including customer sign-ups, number of
3 meters set, cost per connection, and cumulative project costs.

4 Paragraph 13 states that to qualify for the service
5 extension plan, customers must be located within the shaded
6 service area identified in EGU Exhibit 2.02 and must elect to
7 participate within the time frame that is contained in section
8 9.02 of the tariff.

9 Based on the evidence in the record and the
10 stipulation of the parties in this docket, the company requests
11 approval of the settlement stipulation. The company stands
12 ready to start construction upon commission approval.

13 That concludes my summary today. Thank you.

14 MR. COTTAM: Mr. Parks is now available for cross-
15 examination and questions from the hearing officer.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you.

17 Ms. Schmidt, any cross-examination questions?

18 MS. SCHMID: None.

19 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Thank you very
20 much.

21 And Mr. Parks, I have no questions. Thank you.
22 You're excused.

23 Okay. Ms. Schmidt, if you'll call your first witness
24 or your only witness.

25 MS. SCHMID: Thank you. The Division calls Ms.

1 Savannah Torman.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Good afternoon, Ms.

3 Torman.

4 THE WITNESS: Good afternoon.

5 SAVANNAH TORMAN,

6 a witness herein, having been administered an oath,

7 was examined and testified as follows.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Please proceed.

9 EXAMINATION

10 BY MS. SCHMID:

11 Q. Good afternoon.

12 A. Good afternoon.

13 Q. Could you please state and spell your full name for
14 the record.

15 A. Savannah Torman, S-A-V-A-N-N-A-H, T-O-R-M-A-N.

16 Q. By whom are you employed and what is your business
17 address?

18 A. The Division of Public Utilities at 160 East, 300
19 South in Salt Lake City, Utah.

20 Q. What is your title?

21 A. Utility analyst.

22 Q. How long have you worked for the Division?

23 A. Since May of 2025.

24 Q. Am I correct that this is your second time
25 testifying?

1 A. Yes.

2 MS. SCHMID: So she knows that it's a very good
3 world.

4 Q. Because you're relatively new to our world, would you
5 please provide a brief overview of your education and relevant
6 work experience.

7 A. I have a master's in sustainable development and I've
8 worked on demand side management dockets for both Enbridge Gas
9 and Rocky Mountain Power.

10 Q. In conjunction with your employment at the Division,
11 have you participated on behalf of the Division in this docket?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Could you please briefly describe your activities.

14 A. I analyzed the company's application and its
15 associated exhibits, I attended the company's technical
16 conference, I compiled data requests and reviewed the company's
17 responses, and I conferred with my DPU colleagues.

18 Q. Did you also prepare and cause to be filed your
19 direct testimony with its accompanying exhibits?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Did you also participate in the process that led to
22 the settlement stipulation being filed?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. In the Division's opinion, was the process arm's
25 length?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And were the negotiations done in good faith?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Is it the Division's position that the settlement
5 stipulation as filed is just and reasonable in result?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Is it also the Division's position that the
8 settlement stipulation and its approval would be in the public
9 interest?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Do you have a statement supporting the Division's
12 position seeking approval of the stipulation?

13 A. I do.

14 Q. Please proceed.

15 A. My testimony today is to provide the reasons why the
16 Division supports commission approval of the settlement
17 stipulation filed in this docket.

18 On September 19, 2025, Enbridge filed its application
19 for approval of a rural natural gas infrastructure development
20 project to extend service to South Rim, Utah. In its
21 application, the company is asking for the commission to
22 approve its plans to extend natural gas service to the
23 currently unserved area of South Rim and allow it to recover
24 the costs associated with this rural expansion through the
25 rural expansion rate adjustment tracker, as set forth in

1 section 9.02 of its tariff.

2 In 2018, the Utah State Legislature passed House Bill
3 422, which amended existing law to allow natural gas service to
4 be extended to rural communities in Utah and have the costs of
5 that extension of service to be spread to the utility's larger
6 customer rate base, subject to certain limitations set forth in
7 Utah Code and associated commission rules.

8 After reviewing the company's application and
9 testimony, the Division concludes that this settlement
10 stipulation is sufficient to meet the statutory and commission
11 rule requirements. The Division supports the extension of
12 natural gas service to rural communities, in principle,
13 provided that the company provides sufficient evidence to
14 substantiate the extension and costs are justified and
15 reasonable.

16 However, the Division would like to emphasize that
17 the company carries the burden of proof to demonstrate that its
18 resource decisions, including these rural expansion costs, are
19 based on substantial evidence and result in just and reasonable
20 rates for ratepayers.

21 As a result of the Division's review of the company's
22 application and associated information provided by Enbridge in
23 this case, the Division filed its direct testimony with the
24 commission on December 2nd, 2025, recommending denial of the
25 application as filed.

1 After filing direct testimony, the company and
2 Division engaged in settlement negotiations where the
3 Division's concerns were discussed and adequately resolved.
4 This resulted in the settlement stipulation filed with the
5 commission on January 26th, 2026, which is at issue here today.

6 This stipulation is very similar to past rural
7 expansion settlement stipulations approved by the commission.
8 The Division's position is that this stipulation satisfies the
9 necessary requirements under the applicable statutes and rules
10 pertaining to rural expansion.

11 In addition, the terms of this stipulation provide
12 that, beginning in 2027, the company will file with the
13 commission an annual report containing information about its
14 completed and in-progress rural expansion projects for the most
15 recent five-year period. The company has also agreed to hold
16 collaborative meetings with the Division to discuss potential
17 rural expansion project sites prior to filing with the
18 commission an application to extend service to prospective
19 areas.

20 The inclusion of these processes will provide the
21 Division and the commission with more information about the
22 company's rural expansion program.

23 In conclusion, this extension to South Rim could be a
24 benefit to that community and would not create a significant
25 negative impact on the utility or its current customers. The

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1 Division recommends that the commission approve the settlement
2 stipulation as filed to allow the company to extend natural gas
3 service to the area of South Rim, Utah, as it is just and
4 reasonable in result and in their public interest.

5 This concludes my summary. Thank you.

6 Q. I have one question.

7 Did the rebuttal testimony filed by Mr. Parks
8 contribute, at least in part, to the Division's comfort and
9 involvement in the settlement process?

10 A. It did, yes.

11 Q. Thank you.

12 MS. SCHMID: The Division has nothing further for
13 this witness, and she's available for cross-examination and
14 questions from the presiding officer.

15 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Thank you very much.

16 Any questions from the applicant?

17 MR. COTTAM: I have no questions. Thank you.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Give me one
19 second.

20 I don't have any questions either. Thank you very
21 much.

22 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: Okay. Everyone's up,
24 everyone's down; I believe that's it.

25 I'll just restate we've got a statutory deadline of

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1 March 18th, 2026.

2 Any disagreement with that?

3 MS. SCHMID: No.

4 MR. COTTAM: No; no disagreement.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER DELANEY: We're mindful of it, and
6 an order will be issued in due course.

7 Again, I want to thank everybody for the preparation
8 you did in advance to be here today and also all the work you
9 did leading up to the settlement stipulation.

10 Thank you very much. We will be adjourned.
