Re: *Enbridge Gas Utah's Annual Calculation of the Third-Party Billing Rate and Request for Tariff Change*; Docket No. 26-057-T02

Dear Ms. Clark:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the February 26, 2026 filing by Enbridge Gas Utah (EGU) proposing changes to Section 8.08, Billing for Other Entities ("Third-Party Billing Charge") of its Utah Natural Gas Tariff No. 800 ("Tariff"). EGU proposes to revise Page 2 of Section 8.08 to increase (1) the current effective minimum charge per bill from \$0.19338 to \$0.21197; and (2) the current effective charge per line, above 11 lines, from \$0.01758 to \$0.01927. EGU included with the filing Exhibit 1.01, Third-Party Billing Calculation in support of its proposed revisions.

EGU filed the Tariff revisions consistent with the PSC's order approving Third-Party Billing charges in Docket No. 17-057-T04 ("Order Establishing Third-Party Billing").<sup>1</sup> EGU requests an effective date of April 1, 2026.

Section 8.08 provides a formula for calculating the Third-Party Billing Charge, stating that an "eligible third party seeking to utilize [EGU's] utility bill to charge customers must pay a per-line rate based on the total cost to produce a bill divided by the minimum number of lines on a bill," where the "total cost to produce a bill includes depreciation, operation and maintenance, supplies, postage, and return on investment." 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The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on March 11, 2026 (“DPU Comments”), and EGU’s reply comments, filed on March 19, 2026 (“EGU Reply Comments”). DPU reviewed and confirmed that EGU’s calculations of the per bill and per line Third-Party Billing charges were correct. The DPU Comments provide an overview of increases and decreases in certain costs included in the Third-Party Billing Charge calculations since EGU’s last rate adjustment filing. Based on DPU’s review, EGU’s third-party billing program imposes no burden, financial risk, or other costs on ratepayers. Additionally, DPU notes that EGU is not actively marketing the program and has indicated it will discontinue third-party billing at some point. DPU recommends the PSC approve the revised Third-Party Billing Charge as filed, effective April 1, 2026. According to EGU Reply Comments, EGU concurs with DPU’s findings and acknowledges DPU’s efforts in ensuring the proposed rates are correct, and in the public interest.

Based on the PSC’s review of EGU’s filing, DPU Comments, EGU Reply Comments and there being no opposition, the proposed revisions to Page 2 of Section 8.08 of the Tariff are approved, effective April 1, 2026.
