Dear Commissioners,

Today, at 8:00 a.m. MST Rocky Mountain Power issued the attached Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) Notification. Due to significant wildfire risk and expected high, gusty winds, RMP may turn off power as a safety precaution for areas in Central Utah. The Public Safety Power Shutoff may affect approximately 18,000 customers and begin at approximately 7 a.m. on Saturday, June 21st and could last through 7 p.m. that evening. A map of areas included in the PSPS watch can be found here: RockyMountainPower.net/PSPS. The notifications are sent in both English and Spanish, and sent via email, phone, and SMS message. RMP will also work with local media and on social media to share the information as well. Public Safety Power Shutoffs are targeted, precise, and informed by real-time data about the situation on the ground.

I will provide the Commission with updates as the PSPS watch progresses.
