Dear Mr. Murphy,

On December 3, 2025, the Public Service Commission (PSC) received your correspondence on behalf of Fonality, Inc. ("Fonality") and NetFortris Acquisition Co., Inc. ("NetFortris") stating that as of June 30, 2025, Fonality and NetFortris merged into their parent company and are no longer in business, and requesting "to close their [Utah Universal Service Fund Surcharge] accounts." On January 13, 2026, the PSC issued an action request to the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) asking it to review Fonality's and NetFortris's correspondence and verify whether Fonality and NetFortris have a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) or eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) designation and to provide a recommendation addressing the question Fonality and NetFortris posed in its correspondence.

On February 11, 2026, DPU filed its action request response. DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge Fonality and NetFortris do not have a CPCN or ETC designation. You were courtesy copied on DPU's response. The PSC acknowledges that Fonality and NetFortris do not have a CPCN or ETC designation, and based on Fonality's and NetFortris's representation that they are no longer in business, Fonality's and NetFortris's correspondence has been filed and posted to Docket No. 25-999-03.
