**REPLY DECLARATION



1. My name is Patricia Lynott. I am a Vice President of Service Delivery for McLeodUSA Telecommunications Services, Inc. d/b/a PAETEC Business Services ("McLeodUSA"). My business address is 1 Martha's Way, Hiawatha, Iowa 52233.
2. On January 28, 2010, I prepared and submitted an initial Declaration in this proceeding.
3. The purpose of my Reply Declaration is to clarify the functions beyond local number porting that McLeodUSA is required to complete when Qwest submits an LSR to McLeodUSA.
4. Qwest submits and McLeodUSA processes an LSR in some instances regardless of whether the customer is porting all active phone numbers from McLeodUSA to Qwest. For example, depending on the customer's service configuration with McLeodUSA as reflected in the Customer Service Record ("CSR"), Qwest may submit an LSR that requests that McLeodUSA disconnect additional lines that are not being ported to Qwest. Obviously, the processing of an LSR submitted by Qwest involving this type of work for these non-ported phone numbers would not involve activities related to porting those local numbers whatsoever.
5. While processing the LSR facilitates number porting for local services, processing of the LSR also facilitates transition of non-local telecommunications services that the end user customer is moving to the winning carrier. Thus, in addition to local services, the LSR is submitted to direct McLeodUSA to facilitate the movement of other services as internet access, directory listing, and operator services from McLeodUSA to the winning carrier. The processing of the LSR is also necessary to make sure that the 911 database is properly updated so that the customer will continue to have access to essential 911 services.

6. I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
