By The Commission:

THIS MATTER is before the Commission on the petitioner's, Moon Lake Electric (Company), petition to terminate service for Shelley Pettit (Respondent). No hearing was held in this matter. On March 12, 2009, the Division of Public Utilities (Division) sent a certified letter to the respondent informing her that she had until March 23, 2009 to file a protest or a request a hearing with the Commission. On March 19, 2009, the respondent's husband, Ron Taylor, entered into a payment plan to satisfy the arrearage. The past-due balance is \$121.63 with the current bill of \$172.58 due April 1, 2009. The respondent has agreed to pay the balance off in four payments, with a minimum of \$30 due with each installment until the balance is satisfied. The first payment is due April 15, 2009. The Company also seeks leave to terminate the respondent's service if she fails to abide by the terms of the payment agreement.

Therefore, based upon the foregoing information, and for good cause appearing, the Commission orders as follows:

1. The respondent shall pay to the Company, the amount of \$121.63, payable in four payments of at least \$30.00. Payments shall be due on or before the 15th of each month, beginning in April and continuing until the arrearage is satisfied.
2. The Company shall waive interest owing on the arrearage so long as the respondent abides by the terms of this Report and Order.

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3. If the respondent fails to comply with the terms of the payment plan and this Report and Order, the Company shall have the right to disconnect services to respondent's residence in accordance with the Company regulations and tariff provisions and the applicable rules and regulations of the Commission. It shall not be required to seek further approval from the Commission for termination of service, notwithstanding the fact that a resident at respondent's residence may be using life-support equipment. In the event of termination, at least 48 hours prior to terminating said service, the Company shall notify the appropriate Utah state social service agencies of this Order and pending termination. The Company shall be free to pursue any other means of collection available to it under the law to collect any arrearages.
