Dear Mr. Gipson,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed the letter filed January 3, 2022 (“Filing”) by Boomerang Wireless, LLC d/b/a enTouch Wireless (“enTouch”). The Filing gives notice of an update to enTouch’s minimum standard voice plan pricing structure to include a promotional Lifeline broadband service offering (“Promotional Offering”) for customers who also sign up and qualify for a federal affordable connectivity plan on the same device. enTouch states its Promotional Offering meets the Federal Communications Commission’s minimum service standards.

The PSC also reviewed the January 5, 2022 comments filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). DPU recommends the PSC acknowledge the Filing. DPU comments that enTouch is required to notify the PSC of any changes to its service offerings under a Stipulation adopted by the PSC in an order in Docket No. 16-2590-01, and that it sees no reason to deny enTouch’s proposed changes.

Based on the PSC’s review of the Filing and on DPU’s comments and recommendation, the PSC acknowledges receiving the notice described in enTouch’s Filing.
