2	OFFICER HAMMER: Good morning,
3	everyone. This is the time and place noticed for
4	the hearing in the Petition of Assist Wireless, LLC
5	for Designation as an Eligible Telecommunications
б	Carrier in the State of Utah, Commission
7	Docket No. 17-2597-01. My name is Michael Hammer
8	and I'm the Commission's designated presiding
9	officer for this docket. Let's go ahead and take
10	appearances, please. It appears that everyone for
11	the Company is with us by telephone; is that
12	correct?
13	MR. FOSTER: Yes. This is
14	Mark Foster with Foster Law in Austin, Texas,
15	representing Assist Wireless, LLC. With me, also on
16	the teleconference call is Byron Young. He is the
17	president of Assist Wireless.
18	OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you.
19	MR. JETTER: Good morning. I'm
20	Justin Jetter with the Utah Attorney General's
21	Office and I'm here today representing the Utah
22	Division of Public Utilities. With me at counsel
23	table, for those on the phone, is Casey Coleman with
24	the Division.
25	MR. MOORE: I'm Robert Moore with the

Page 5 Utah Attorney General's Office, representing the 1 2 Office of Consumer Service. With me is 3 Cheryl Murray of the Office. 4 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank vou. Are 5 there any preliminary matters before we begin? 6 MR. JETTER: Nothing from the Division. 7 8 MR. FOSTER: I don't have any. 9 OFFICER HAMMER: I suppose the parties are okay with the Company's witness 10 testifying by telephone today? 11 12 MR. JETTER: Yes, we are. 13 MR. MOORE: We have no objections. 14 OFFICER HAMMER: All right, then. Mr. Foster, please call your first witness. 15 16 MR. FOSTER: I'll call Byron Young. Mr. Young, will you state your name and position, 17 18 please? 19 OFFICER HAMMER: Before you proceed, Mr. Young, do you swear to tell the truth today? 20 21 THE WITNESS: Yes. 2.2 BYRON YOUNG, 23 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was examined and testified as follows: 24 25 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you. 18	A California and Oklahoma.
19	Q All right. And are you willing and able
20	to abide by the rules of the Public Service
21	Commission of Utah with respect to provision of
22	Lifeline service in Utah?
23	A Yes.
24	Q And likewise, will you abide by the rules
25	and regulations of the Federal Communications
1	

Page 7 1 Commission with respect to provision of Lifeline 2 service to Utah residents? 3 А Yes. 4 0 And are you also familiar with a 5 stipulation and settlement agreement that's been executed in this docket? 6 7 Yes, I am. А And is the information presented therein 8 0 9 true and correct and agreeable to your company? 10 Α Yes. 11 And will you abide by the provisions of Q 12 the stipulation settlement agreement? 13 А Yes. 14 0 Do you believe that the terms and conditions of the stipulation settlement agreement 15 are in the public interest? 16 Yes, I do. 17 А MR. FOSTER: Your Honor, I don't have 18 19 any more questions for Mr. Young. I'm happy to 20 hinder him for any cross-examination or clarifying 21 questions that might be needed, and if there's 22 anything else that you would like me to submit or 23 ask Mr. Young, I'm happy to do so. Also, if it's needed for your evidentiary record, we would offer 24 25 the contents of the application and all attachments

Page 8 therein, as well as the stipulation settlement 1 2 agreement into evidence at this time. 3 OFFICER HAMMER: I see no objection. 4 They're admitted. Mr. Jetter, any cross-examination? 5 6 MR. JETTER: I have no questions. 7 Thank you. 8 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore? 9 MR. MOORE: No questions. Thank you. 10 OFFICER HAMMER: All right, 11 Mr. Foster. You have no other witnesses, correct? 12 MR. FOSTER: That's correct. 13 OFFICER HAMMER: Okay. Mr. Jetter? 14 MR. JETTER: Thank you. The Division would like to call and have sworn in 15 16 Mr. Casey Coleman. 17 CASEY J. COLEMAN, having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was 18 examined and testified as follows: 19 20 BY MR. JETTER: 21 0 Mr. Coleman, will you please state your 22 name and occupation for the record? 23 А My name is Casey J. Coleman. I'm a utility technical consultant for the State of Utah 24 25 and the Division of Public Utilities.

Page 9 1 Thank you. In the course of your 0 2 employment, have you had the opportunity to review 3 the application filed by the applicant in this 4 docket, as well as the settlement stipulation that was filed by the parties? 5 6 Α Yes. Do you believe that approval by the 7 0 Commission of the settlement stipulation would be 8 just, reasonable, and in the public interest? 9 10 А Yes. 11 Q Thank you. 12 MR. JETTER: I have no further 13 questions and Mr. Coleman is available for cross-examination. 14 15 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Foster, any 16 questions? 17 MR. FOSTER: No questions. 18 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore? 19 MR. MOORE: No questions. 20 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Jetter, you have 21 no other witnesses? 2.2 MR. JETTER: I have no other 23 witnesses. 24 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore? 25 MR. MOORE: The Office would call

Page 10 1 Cheryl Murray. 2 CHERYL MURRAY, 3 having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was examined and testified as follows: 4 MR. MOORE: Please state your name 5 6 and who you represent in this docket. 7 THE WITNESS: My name is Cheryl Murray. I represent the Office of Consumer 8 9 Services. 10 0 Did you participate in the settlement 11 negotiation which resulted in the stipulation being 12 considered today? 13 Yes, I did, on behalf of the Office. Α Is the application of Assist Wireless 14 0 15 seeking Utah USF funding? 16 Yes, however, as noted in the stipulation А at page 7B, the Commission bifurcated this docket so 17 that the immediate proceeding will adjudicate Assist 18 Wireless's request for designation as an eligible 19 20 telecommunications provider for the purpose of 21 receiving federal Lifeline support for its Utah 22 customers. The request for Utah USF will be 23 adjudicated after the Commission makes rules 24 governing wireless providers' eligibility for state 25 Lifeline support.

Page 11 1 0 Have you prepared testimony regarding the 2 stipulation? 3 А Yes. 4 0 Please proceed. The Office of Consumer Services is 5 Α responsible for assessing the impact of utility rate 6 7 changes and regulatory actions upon residential and commercial customers. It is with that 8 responsibility in mind that we have evaluated Assist 9 10 Wireless's request for limited designation as an ETC 11 for the purpose of providing Lifeline service to 12 qualified residential customers in Utah. 13 The Office acknowledges that low-income 14 persons need to have access to telephone service 15 and, in general, supports the ability to receive that service through wireless telephone service. 16 We 17 considered both the benefits provided to low-income customers through wireless service and the money 18 collected from telecommunications customers 19 20 necessary to fund the Lifeline program in our 21 assessment. We have reviewed the testimony, the 2.2 exhibits, and we have also issued some data requests 23 and had discussions with Company representatives in 24 coming to our conclusion here. Subsequent to our review of the information, the parties entered into 25

Page 12 1 the stipulation and settlement agreement that's 2 being presented today. 3 In the Office's judgment, the settlement 4 is just and reasonable in result, and in the public interest, and should be approved by the Commission. 5 6 That concludes my testimony. 7 MR. MOORE: Ms. Murray is available for cross. 8 9 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Foster, any questions? 10 11 MR. FOSTER: No questions, Your 12 Honor. 13 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Jetter? 14 MR. JETTER: I have no questions. 15 Thank you. 16 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore, anything 17 else? 18 MR. MOORE: No, sir. 19 OFFICER HAMMER: Before we adjourn, I 20 suppose I'll ask the parties how we envision the 21 second stage of this matter proceeding. In other 22 words, would you like me to notice a scheduling conference at some future date? I don't know if 23 there's still language on our docket indefinitely. 24 25 MR. FOSTER: Honestly, Your Honor,

Page 13 1 I'm a little unfamiliar with your processes there in 2 Utah. Could you perhaps let me know, what have you 3 done in previous cases? 4 OFFICER HAMMER: I think this situation is a little unique. Let me ask Mr. Jetter 5 6 and Mr. Moore if they have any recommendations. 7 MR. JETTER: I think maybe there may 8 be two options that we could do here. One would be 9 since we don't know -- I'm not familiar enough with the docket to know if there was a final date --10 11 dates regarding the conclusion of the wireless 12 Lifeline rule. I don't think we have a known 13 endpoint of the process that needs to be completed before we go forward with the evaluation of Lifeline 14 15 support for Assist Wireless. At least, in my 16 opinion, the best way to do that might be to withdraw the request or have the Company withdraw 17 18 that request and then file a new application pending after the conclusion of setting the parameters which 19 Lifeline support would be available to wireless 20 21 providers in Utah. 2.2 And the alternative, the only other 23 way that I think it might work, would be to have 24 some sort of an order that would set a scheduling 25 conference a certain time after the conclusion of

1	Page 14 that, but since we don't know when that is, I don't
2	know if we can set a date for it. I think the
3	trouble is suspending it indefinitely, which it
4	sounds like that's not what the Commission prefers
5	to do. I think the best option would actually be to
6	have a separate docket with a new application which
7	would be focused on whatever the rules would be.
8	OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Moore, anything?
9	MR. MOORE: We would concur with the
10	Division.
11	MR. FOSTER: Your Honor, this is
12	Mark Foster. I hate to interrupt but I'm going to
13	have to confess that the sound quality is so poor I
14	can barely make out anything you all are saying. I
15	didn't want to interrupt too much, but if there's
16	something that can be done or maybe at the end of
17	your discussions, just kind of advise me on the
18	bottom line, off of the speaker phone, that would be
19	fantastic.
20	OFFICER HAMMER: Sure. Can you hear
21	me, Mr. Foster?
22	MR. FOSTER: Yes, I hear you just
23	fine. Thanks.
24	OFFICER HAMMER: So I asked the
25	Division and the Office's counsel for input as to

1	Page 15 how they suggested proceeding. Mr. Jetter, correct
2	me if I'm wrong, but I understood the recommendation
3	to be that either the Company withdraw its
4	application for Utah USF and refile at a later date
5	once rules are in place to evaluate that request or
6	we could perhaps stay this case pending further
7	action from the Company. I suppose a third
8	alternative would be to simply notice up a
9	scheduling conference at some future date, though we
10	don't know whether rules will be in place at that
11	date to continue the adjudication.
12	MR. FOSTER: I think I know how we
13	would like to proceed, would be to move ahead with
14	this request for the federal ETC designation and we
15	could withdraw our request for the to be
16	reimbursed from the Utah fund and refile that when
17	you have finalized the rules.
18	OFFICER HAMMER: Are you making a
19	verbal motion to do that at this time?
20	MR. FOSTER: Yes, Your Honor, I am.
21	OFFICER HAMMER: Then the order on
22	the ETC designation will also include an order
23	approving the request to withdraw the other
24	application, pending further action from the
25	Company.
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1	Page 16 MR. FOSTER: And if I could ask those
2	present, if anyone can give me a time estimate for
3	when they think the Commission will have finalized
4	the new rules?
5	OFFICER HAMMER: I suppose I'm in the
6	best position to do that, and unfortunately it's not
7	a good one. I'm sorry I don't have an answer for
8	you, but I can look into it and speak with the
9	Commissioners and see if there's any way we can
10	apprise the parties of an estimate. I'm not sure
11	whether they're in a position to do so or not.
12	MR. FOSTER: That would be very
13	appreciated, and I'll calendar in my system to
14	follow up with those there that I've been working
15	with in the Commission.
16	OFFICER HAMMER: Excellent. Thank
17	you, everyone. We're adjourned.
