Dear Ms. Kirby,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) reviewed the December 11, 2020 filing by i-wireless, LLC (“i-wireless”) of an update to its Lifeline service offering. i-wireless has increased its broadband Lifeline offering for customers with a smart device to include 1,250 voice minutes, along with 4.5 GB of data per month, and unlimited text messages. The PSC also reviewed the December 17, 2020 action request response filed by the Division of Public Utilities (DPU). DPU confirms i-wireless’s offering complies with the Federal Communications Commission’s minimum service standards, and recommends the PSC acknowledge i-wireless’s proposed changes to its Lifeline offering and allow the effective date to be December 1, 2020.

Based on the PSC’s review of the filing and DPU’s response, the PSC acknowledges receiving i-wireless’s notice of changes to its Lifeline service offering as described in its December 11, 2020 filing.
