Dear Mr. Brinton,

The Utah Public Service Commission ("PSC") has reviewed CenturyLink's proposed revisions to Section 2 Page 7 of its Access Service Tariff Utah ("Tariff"), transmitted with Advice Letter No. 2019-T01 on April 25, 2019. CenturyLink proposes to update the language associated with Discontinuance of Services by eliminating the use of certified U.S. Mail and allowing customer notice by email if the customer is billed electronically or consents to receiving electronic notification. CenturyLink plans to make the filing effective on May 1, 2019. The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities ("DPU") filed on May 1, 2019. The DPU supports CenturyLink's proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve them.

Based on the DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves CenturyLink's proposed revisions to its Tariff as filed, with an effective date of May 1, 2019.¹

¹ Going forward, the PSC reminds CenturyLink of the requirements to: 1) file tariff changes at least 30 days prior to the requested effective date as specified in Utah Administrative Code ("UAC") R746-405-1(C)(2); 2) file clean and redline versions of the proposed tariff sheet (UAC R746-405-2(D)(6)); and 3) provide a statement that the proposed tariff sheet does not constitute a violation of state law or PSC rule (UAC R746-405-2(D)(3)(g)).
