The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah dba Frontier Communications of Utah's ("Frontier") proposed revisions to Sheet Nos. 1, 69, and 70 of its Schedule No. A-3, Bundled Services ("Tariff"), transmitted on April 20, 2021. The purpose of this filing is to introduce Frontier Unlimited Voice and Feature Bundle, and make it available to residential customers where it is technically feasible. Frontier requests an effective date of May 23, 2021 for these changes.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on May 3, 2021. The DPU states it has no objections to the proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve Frontier's proposed revisions to the Tariff with the requested effective date. According to DPU, the proposed Tariff revisions will not affect Frontier's overall revenue picture and no other rates are affected.

Based on its review of Frontier's filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves Frontier's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective May 23, 2021.
