Re: *Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah d/b/a Frontier Communications of Utah's Tariff Revisions to the 8YY Access Charge Rates; Docket No. 21-041-T02*

Dear Ms. Zink,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah d/b/a Frontier Communications of Utah's ("Frontier") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 1, 5, 471, and 471.1, of its Utah P.S.C. No. 1-T Tariff ("Tariff"), transmitted on May 17, 2021. The purpose of this filing is to comply with Federal Communications Commission amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform.¹ Frontier's proposed Tariff revisions list exempt rates as it otherwise already complies with the FCC's 8YY access charge reform order. Frontier requests an effective date of July 1, 2021 for these changes.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on May 27, 2021. DPU states it has no objections to the proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve Frontier's proposed revisions to the Tariff with the requested effective date.

Based on the PSC's review of Frontier's filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves Frontier's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2021.
