The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed South Central Utah Telephone Association, Inc.'s ("SCUTA") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 3, 3.1, 3.3, 44, 76.1, 87, 87.2, 87.3, 89, 109.22, 109.23, 109.24, 124.1, 230.1, 230.2, 231, and 233 of its P.S.C.U. No. 1 Tariff ("Tariff"), transmitted on May 27, 2021. The purpose of this filing is to comply with Federal Communications Commission amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform.¹ This reform requires all rate-of-return incumbent local exchange carriers to modify originating 8YY rates in the following groups: End Office/Local Switching, Transport, and Query Charge. SCUTA requests an effective date of July 1, 2021.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 9, 2021. DPU states it has no objections to the proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve SCUTA's proposed revisions to the Tariff with the requested effective date. According to DPU, the Tariff revisions are in compliance with the 8YY access charge reform rules.

Based on the PSC's review of SCUTA's filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves SCUTA's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2021.
