Re: *Carbon/Emery Telcom, Inc.'s Proposed Tariff Revisions*; Docket No. 21-2302-T01

Dear Mr. Woolsey,

The Public Service Commission (PSC) has reviewed Carbon/Emery Telcom, Inc.'s ("Carbon") proposed revisions to Page Nos. 2, 35, 36, 37, 46, 47, 48, 49, and 50 of its Intrastate Access Tariff PSC Utah No. 2 ("Tariff"), transmitted on May 21, 2021. The purpose of this filing is twofold; first, to comply with Federal Communications Commission amended rules that implement 8YY access charge reform.¹ Second, to include additional incremental ETS speed service offerings. The 8YY reform requires all rate-of-return incumbent local exchange carriers to modify originating 8YY rates in the following groups: End Office/Local Switching, Transport, and Query Charge. Carbon requests an effective date of July 1, 2021 for these changes.

The PSC also reviewed the comments of the Division of Public Utilities (DPU) filed on June 3, 2021. DPU states it has no objections to the proposed changes and recommends the PSC approve Carbon's proposed revisions to the Tariff with the requested effective date. According to DPU, the Tariff revisions are consistent with the FCC's 8YY Access Charge Reform Order.

Based on the PSC's review of Carbon's filing and DPU's comments and recommendation, the PSC approves Carbon's proposed revisions to its Tariff, as filed, effective July 1, 2021.
