Re: **Docket No. 22-049-T01, TARIFF** Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC's Tariff Revisions to reduce or eliminate 8YY originating access charges to comply with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) 8YY Reform Order.

Recommendation (Approve Tariff Sheets)

The Division of Public Utilities (DPU or Division) has reviewed the tariff filing and recommends the Public Service Commission (PSC or Commission) approve Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC's (CenturyLink or Company) request to revise the 8YY Access Charge Rates. The Division therefore recommends the tariff change become effective on July 1, 2022.

Issue

On June 24, 2022, CenturyLink submitted to the Commission, Advice Letter A.L 2202-T01 including revised tariff sheets and redlined copies, with the purpose to revise the tariff rates as required in the FCC's 8YY Access Charge Reform, Report and Order FCC 20-143, WC Docket No. 18-156, adopted October 7, 2020.¹ The Commission issued an Action Request on June 24, 2022, for the Division to investigate the proposed changes and report its findings and recommendation to the Commission as soon as possible. This memorandum represents the Division's response to the Commission's Action Request.

Background

In October 2020, the FCC adopted an order to modernize rules for toll free (8YY) calling. The order steps down 8YY originating access charges to a bill-and-keep system over a transition period beginning July 1, 2021 and ending July 1, 2023. Originating 8YY transport and tandem switching fees were combined to a single transport service rate capped at \$0.001 per minute effective July 1, 2021. Charges for 8YY database queries will also be transitioned to \$0.0002 over the three-year transition period. Additionally, the order combines separate 8YY transport and tandem switching charges into a single access charge.²

Discussion

The Division reviewed the redlined version of the tariff sheets submitted with the Company's filing. The proposed rates for end office originating access and database access have been reduced by 50 percent as required by the stepdown reduction plan and appear to comply with the FCC's 8YY Reform Order. No other rates were affected by the order and no other rate changes were proposed.

Conclusion

The Division has reviewed CenturyLink's filing and has no objections to the proposed revisions. Therefore, the Division recommends the Commission approve this filing as submitted, with an effective date of July 1, 2022, as requested.
